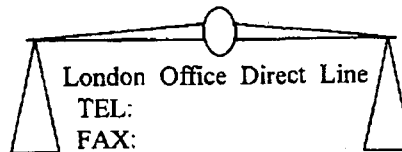

3. We consider the consultation paper be withdrawn and the proposal amended. The Proposal appears to be wholly misconceived.
