1. This Licence is issued by the Office of Communications ("Ofcom") on 'Date of issue' and replaces any previous authority granted in respect of the service subject to this Licence by Ofcom or by the Secretary of State.
2. This Licence authorises ("the Licensee") to establish, install and/or use radio transmitting and/or receiving stations and/or radio apparatus as described in the schedule(s) (hereinafter together called "the Radio Equipment") subject to the terms set out below and subject to the terms of the General Licence Conditions booklet. (Version OF195.1).

SCHEDULE 1 TO LICENCE NUMBER *****

DESCRIPTION OF RADIO EQUIPMENT COVERED BY THIS LICENCE

This schedule forms part of Licence ***** , issued to the Licensee on 'Date of issue', and describes the Radio Equipment covered by the Licence and the purpose for which the Radio Equipment may be used.

1. Description of the Radio Equipment licensed

In this Licence, the Radio Equipment means sending and receiving station(s) ("base stations") and sending and receiving station(s) ("mobile stations") for wireless telegraphy as defined in paragraph 2 below.

2. Purpose of the Radio Equipment

Subject to the administrative and technical requirements set out in this and the subsequent schedule(s) to this Licence, the Licensee and any person authorised to act on the Licensee's behalf is hereby authorised to:

- (a) send and receive messages concerning the business of the Licensee between the base station(s) and the mobile station(s); and/or
- (b) send and receive messages concerning the business of the Licensee between the mobile stations.

3. Conformity Assessment Requirements

The Radio Equipment covered by this Licence shall be subject to and comply with the appropriate Interface Requirement (IR) or for equipment first placed on the market before 8 April 2000, is required to be type approved in accordance with the appropriate published technical performance standards authorised at the date of installation of the Radio Equipment, subject to any modifications authorised by Ofcom.

4. Special conditions relating to the activities of the Licensee

- (a) The Licensee shall ensure that the Radio Equipment is:
 - i. used for voice transmission only, unless authorised in paragraph 5 below or in the subsequent schedule(s);
 - ii. not used to transmit music, broadcast programmes or obscene or offensive language;

- iii. not used as a public address system; and
 - iv. not used to send misleading messages.
- (b) Upon receipt of messages not connected with the business of the Licensee, the Licensee or any person using the Radio Equipment shall not:
- i. make known the contents of any such message, its origin or destination, its existence or the fact of its receipt to any person, except to a duly authorised officer of the Her Majesty's Government, a person authorised by Ofcom or in the course of legal proceedings or for the purpose of any report thereof; and
 - ii. retain any copy or make any use of any such message, or allow it to be reproduced in writing, copied or made use of.

5. Facilities

The use of the following facilities is permitted without specific authorisation, provided that no undue interference is caused to other authorised radio users:

- (a) revertive calling;
- (b) user identification;
- (c) overlay paging, provided that the number of overlay pagers does not exceed the number of mobile stations in the service subject to this Licence;
- (d) quasi-synchronous operation of base stations;
- (e) remote receivers;
- (f) selective calling; and
- (g) the following methods of voice privacy :
 - i. frequency inversion;
 - ii. band inversion;
 - iii. band scrambling; and
 - iv. rolling code inversion.
- (h) the use of DTMF for PSTN and/or PABX interconnection is authorised.
- (i) interconnection with a private branch exchange (PBX) and the public switched telephone network (PSTN) is authorized.

- (j) The use of talkthrough on this service is authorised.
- (k) Pip (busy) tones may be transmitted by the base station(s), provided that no interference is caused to other users.
- (l) Data transmission is authorised, provided that no interference is caused to other users.
- (m) Single frequency mobile transmit operation is allowed for incident management purposes.

6. Base stations

The Licensee shall ensure that:

- (a) base stations do not communicate directly with other base stations; and
- (b) base stations located at shared sites shall not be used in single frequency mode.

7. Call signs

- (a) The Licensee shall ensure that the call sign:
 - i. is announced at the beginning of all transmissions; and
 - ii. is transmitted in the same format that is being used for the transmission of the information.
- (b) The call sign(s) shall be as specified in the subsequent schedule(s).

8. Interpretation

In this and the subsequent schedule(s):

- (a) “national” means radio coverage throughout the United Kingdom;
- (b) “regional” means radio coverage throughout one or more, but not all, of England, Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland;
- (c) “revertive calling” means the automatic acknowledgement of messages received by mobile stations by means of predefined status messages;
- (d) “user identification” identifies the user sending a message;
- (e) “overlay paging” allows a user who temporarily leaves their mobile station to be alerted to the fact that a message has been sent to the mobile station;

- (f) “quasi-synchronous operation of base stations” is where more than one base station transmits the same message on the same channel in different areas;
- (g) “remote receiver” is a mobile station that receives messages on licensed frequencies only;
- (h) “selective calling” is a sequence of in-band audio tones normally transmitted immediately prior to the commencement of a voice transmission or transmitted on their own to convey information;
- (i) “shared site” is a site with more than one base station where the base stations do not share common facilities such as an antenna and/or coupling facilities;
- (j) “single frequency mode” means the use of a single frequency for both transmitting and receiving messages;
- (k) “ERP” means effective radiated power, which is the power radiated from the antenna in the direction of maximum radiation; and
- (l) “IR” means the United Kingdom Radio Interface Requirement published by Ofcom in accordance with Article 4.1 of Directive 1999/5/EC of the European Parliament and of the Council on radio equipment and telecommunications terminal equipment (RTTE) and mutual recognition of their conformity. The Directive was implemented in the UK by the Radio Equipment and Telecommunications Terminal Equipment Regulations (S.I. 2000/730).
