ADDENDUM TO 2ND CONSULTATION ON LIMITATION OF NUMBERS OF SPECTRUM LICENCES: JUNE 2003

It has come to the Agency's attention that in its current 2nd consultation on "Limitation of Numbers of Spectrum Licences: June 2003", that seven footnotes to Schedule 11 Part 1 were omitted, and two typing errors in Schedule 10 from the published version.

Therefore, would you replace the original Schedule 11 Part 1, with the amended version set out below:

"SCHEDULE 11

PART 1

FREQUENCIES ALLOCATED TO PRIVATE BUSINESS RADIO USE

1. In this schedule "Private Business Radio Use" means use of radio, which is commercial in nature and includes uses, which are for the management or control of an organisation.
