LICENCE GRANTED TO THE CHANNEL FOUR TELEVISION CORPORATION TO
PROVIDE

THE CHANNEL 4 SERVICE UNDER PART I OF THE BROADCASTING ACT 1990

THE LICENCE

1. The Independent Television Commission (the "Commission") in exercise of the powers conferred upon it by Part I of the Broadcasting Act 1990 as amended by the Broadcasting Act 1996 hereby grants to the Channel Four Television Corporation ("the Corporation") a licence ("the Licence") subject to the conditions set out in the Schedule and in Part II of the Annex, to provide the Channel 4 Service (as defined in Condition 1 of Part 1 of the Schedule to this Licence).
2. This Licence shall come into force on 1st January 2003 and subject to the said conditions shall be for a term of ten years.

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PART 1

1. Definitions and Interpretation

(1) In these Conditions and in the Annex unless the context otherwise requires: -

"the Act" means the Broadcasting Act 1990 as amended by the Broadcasting Act 1996;

"the 1996 Act" means the Broadcasting Act 1996;

"Analogue Channel 4 Service" means the analogue television broadcasting service known as Channel 4;

"BSC" means the Broadcasting Standards Commission;

"Channel 4 Service" means, prior to the Qualifying Channel 4 Service Commencement Date, the Analogue Channel 4 Service and thereafter the Analogue Channel 4 Service and the Qualifying Channel 4 Service, or either of them, as the context may require;

"Code of Advertising and Sponsorship" means the code governing standards and practice in advertising and in the sponsoring of programmes in the provision of licensed services as drawn up and from time to time revised by the Commission in accordance with Section 9 of the Act;

"Code on Sports and Other Listed Events" means the code governing the televising of sports and other listed events as drawn up and from time to time revised by the Commission in accordance with Section 104 of the 1996 Act;

"Commencement Date" means the date referred to in Clause 2 of the Licence;

references to a "connected person" in relation to the Licence shall be interpreted in accordance with paragraph 3 of Part I of Schedule 2 to the Act;

"Distribution" means, in relation to the Analogue Channel 4 Service, the conveyance of that service (by whatever means and whether directly or indirectly) to the broadcasting stations from which it is broadcast for general reception;

references to programming, programmes or matter of "European origin" shall be interpreted in accordance with the definition of "European Works" in Article 6 of the EC Directive on Television of 3rd October, 1989 (89/552/EEC) as amended by Article 1(7) of EC Directive 97/36/EC of 30th June, 1997;

references to a "fairness complaint" shall be interpreted in accordance with Section 110(4) of the 1996 Act;

"Independent Productions" means programmes of such description as the Secretary of State shall pursuant to Section 16(5) of the Act from time to time by order specify;

"Initial Licence Period" means the period of ten years from the Commencement Date;

"Licence Period" means the Initial Licence Period or any Subsequent Licence Period, as the context shall require;

"licensed services" means services licensed by the Commission under Part I of the Act;

the "Prescribed Minimum Income" of the Corporation, shall be defined in accordance with Section 26(2) of the Act, subject to any order from time to time made by the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 26(10) thereof;

"previewing" in relation to an advertisement intended for inclusion in the Channel 4 Service, refers to the viewing of such advertisement by the Commission in advance of it being broadcast for general reception;

"programme", save where otherwise specified, includes an advertisement and any item included in the Channel 4 Service;

"Programme Code" means the code giving guidance as to the rules to be observed with respect to programmes included in licensed services and as to other matters concerning standards and practice for such programmes as drawn up and from time to time revised by the Commission in accordance with Section 7 of the Act;

"Qualifying Channel 4 Service" means the qualifying television broadcasting service in respect of which the Analogue Channel 4 Service is the corresponding analogue service;

"Qualifying Channel 4 Service Commencement Date" means 19th December, 1998 or such earlier date as the Licensee may notify to the Commission in writing or such later date as may be agreed in writing between the Commission and the Licensee;

"Qualifying Programmes" means programmes of such description as the Secretary of State shall pursuant to Section 16(5) of the Act from time to time by order specify;

the "Qualifying Revenue" of the Corporation for any year means the aggregate of:-

- (a) all payments received or to be received by it or by any connected person:
 - (i) in consideration of the inclusion in the Analogue Channel 4 Service in that period of advertisements or other programmes; or

(ii) in respect of charges made by it in that period for the reception of programmes included in the Analogue Channel 4 Service; and

- (b) the amount of any direct or indirect financial benefit derived by the Corporation or any connected person from payments made by any person by way of sponsorship, for the purpose of defraying or contributing towards costs incurred or to be incurred in connection with any programme included in the Analogue Channel 4 Service,

ascertained in accordance with Section 19(2) to (6) of the Act (as the same have effect pursuant to Section 26(9) of the Act) and the statement of principles drawn up and revised from time to time by the Commission in consultation with the Secretary of State and the Treasury pursuant to Part I of Schedule 7 thereto;

"racial group" has the same meaning as in the Race Relations Act 1976;

"Relevant Amount" means the amount by which the aggregate of:

- (a) the Corporation's Qualifying Revenue for the year in question; and
(b) any amount which, at the beginning of that year, is for the time being standing to the credit of the Reserve Fund,

is less than the amount of the Corporation's Prescribed Minimum Income for that year;

"Reserve Fund" has the meaning set out in Condition 4(1);

"schools programmes" means programmes which are intended for use in schools;

references to a "standards complaint" shall be interpreted in accordance with Section 110(4) of the 1996 Act;

"Statement of Programme Policy" means the statement drawn up by the members of the Corporation prior to the commencement of Section 23 of the Act and approved by the Commission and set out in Part I of the Annex (as varied from time to time in accordance with Conditions 6 and 23);

"Statement on New Ventures" means the statement set out in Part IV of the Annex (as varied from time to time in accordance with Condition 23);

"Subsequent Licence Period" means any period of ten years from the date on which the Licence is renewed in accordance with Condition 15;

"Technical Performance Code" means the code governing technical standards and practice in:-

- (a) programme production and acquisition;
- (b) broadcasting for general reception; and
- (c) Distribution,

in the provision of licensed services as drawn up and from time to time revised by the Commission.

- (2) The Interpretation Act 1978 shall apply for the purpose of interpreting these Conditions and the Conditions in the Annex as if they were an Act of Parliament.
- (3) Any word or expression used in these Conditions and in the Annex shall unless otherwise defined herein and/or the context otherwise requires have the same meaning as it has in the Act.
- (4) For the purposes of interpreting these Conditions and the Conditions in the Annex headings and titles to any Condition shall be disregarded.
- (5) The Licence shall be governed by English law.

PART 22. Provision of the Channel 4 Service by the Corporation

(1) The Corporation shall provide the Analogue Channel 4 Service for the Licence Period for so much of England, Scotland, Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man, and the Bailiwicks of Jersey and Guernsey as may from time to time be reasonably practicable by procuring that the programmes to be included in the Analogue Channel 4 Service are broadcast from the stations specified in, and otherwise in accordance with the Annex, on each day of the week and for up to 24 hours a day Provided that the Commission may (having first consulted the Corporation) from time to time by notice to the Corporation amend the Annex:-

(a) by substituting for any station or stations therein referred to, a reference to any other station or stations serving substantially the whole of the area previously served by the stations so substituted; and/or

(b) by adding to the stations therein referred to a reference to an additional station or stations serving an additional area, whether or not such additional area is served in whole or in part by another station from which programmes are broadcast on Channel 4; and/or

(c) by deleting references to any station or stations where such deletion is required pursuant to the revocation by the Secretary of State, under Section 65(4) of the Act, of the assignment of any frequency,

and any such variation shall take effect on such date or event as the Commission shall in such notice specify whereupon the Annex shall be deemed to have been amended so as to include particulars of the broadcasting stations as so varied.

(1A) The Corporation shall provide the Qualifying Channel 4 Service for broadcast by the holder of the C3/C4 multiplex licence as defined in the Independent Analogue Broadcasters (Reservation of Digital Capacity) Order 1996 (SI 1996/2760) from the Qualifying Channel 4 Service Commencement Date to the end of the Licence Period.

(2) Nothing in this Licence shall constitute or imply any warranty, representation or obligation on the part of the Commission as to the size or location of the areas actually capable of receiving the programmes provided by the Corporation pursuant to the Licence.

(3) The Corporation shall not be authorised by or under the Licence to broadcast or procure the broadcasting of anything other than the Channel 4 Service, subtitling in connection with programmes on Channel 4 and services (other than subtitling) which are ancillary to programmes included in the Channel 4 Service and directly related to their contents or relate to the promotion or listing of such programmes.

2A. Participation in new ventures by the Corporation

The Corporation shall ensure that its participation in any new venture complies with the requirements and principles set out in the Statement on New Ventures.

3. Fees

(1) The Corporation shall pay to the Commission such fees as the Commission may determine in accordance with the tariff fixed by it and for the time being in force under Section 4(3) of the Act, details of which, and of any revision whereof, the Commission shall provide to the Corporation in writing.

(2) Payment of the fees referred to in Condition 3(1) shall be made in such manner as the Commission shall specify Provided that unless the Commission specifically otherwise requires:-

(a) where the annual amount of the fee is less than the Designated Amount, it shall be payable on the Commencement Date and on each anniversary thereof throughout the Licence Period; and

(b) where the annual amount of the fee is equal to or more than the Designated Amount, it shall be payable in advance by equal monthly instalments throughout the Licence Period the first such instalment being payable on the Commencement Date.

(3) For the purposes of this Condition 3, the "Designated Amount" means the sum of £25,000, or such other sum as the Commission may from time to time specify.

4. Treatment of funds

(1) (a) The Corporation shall establish a reserve fund under Section 27(3)(a) of the Act (the "Reserve Fund"), the management and application of which shall, subject to any direction given to the Corporation by the Secretary of State under Section 27(5) of the Act and subject to paragraph (b) below, be as the Corporation may determine.

(b) The Corporation shall not apply any part of the Reserve Fund otherwise than for the purposes of Channel 4.

(2) If the Corporation is notified by the Commission that, in respect of any year, the Commission have imposed a levy under Section 26(3) of the Act and that the aggregate amount transmitted by it to the Corporation under Section 26(6) of the Act exceeds the Relevant Amount, the Corporation shall, as soon as reasonably practicable after receiving such a notification (but in any event by 14 February in the year immediately following the year in respect of which the levy has been imposed), repay to the Commission the amount of the excess.

- (3) If the Qualifying Revenue of the Corporation for any year exceeds the Corporation's Prescribed Minimum Income for that year, the Corporation: -
- (a) shall pay 50 per cent of the excess to the Commission as soon as reasonably practicable after the amount of the Qualifying Revenue of the Corporation for the year in question has been ascertained (but in any event by 14 February in the year immediately following the year in question);
 - (b) shall apply the remainder of the excess as follows:
 - (i) 50 per cent of the remainder of the excess shall be carried by the Corporation to the Reserve Fund; and
 - (ii) the remainder of the excess may be applied by the Corporation towards meeting current expenditure incurred by the Corporation in connection with the provision of the Channel 4 Service, but to the extent that it is not so applied the Corporation shall carry it to the credit of the Reserve Fund; and
 - (c) Condition 4(3) shall have effect subject to and in accordance with the terms of any order made by the Secretary of State under Section 27(7) of the Act

5. Interest on late payments and V.A.T.

- (1) Any payment due from the Corporation under or in respect of the Licence shall carry interest at three per cent. over the base rate for the time being of National Westminster Bank PLC (or if unavailable then the rate published by another clearing bank as selected by the Commission) from the date such payment was due until the date of actual payment.
- (2) The Corporation's liability to pay to the Commission the amounts payable by it under Condition 5(1) shall accrue from day to day and shall be calculated on the basis of a year of 365 days and for the actual number of days elapsed.
- (3)
 - (a) The Corporation shall pay any V.A.T. on any supply for V.A.T. purposes by the Commission under the Licence.
 - (b) Without limitation to paragraph (a) above, all sums payable or other consideration to be given by the Corporation are exclusive of V.A.T. which shall be paid by the Corporation in addition to such sums or consideration.
 - (c) In this Condition 5(3), V.A.T. means value added tax and any similar tax.

6. Programme standards and requirements

- (1) The Corporation shall ensure that the Channel 4 Service complies with the requirements of the Act and in particular that:-
- (a) nothing is included in the Channel 4 Service which offends against good taste or decency or is likely to encourage or incite to crime or to lead to disorder or to be offensive to public feeling;
 - (b) any news given (in whatever form) in the programmes included in the Channel 4 Service is presented with due accuracy and impartiality;
 - (c) due impartiality is preserved on the part of the Corporation as respects matters of political or industrial controversy or relating to current public policy. For the purposes of this paragraph (c) a series of programmes may be considered as a whole and the Corporation shall ensure that the provisions of the code of guidance as drawn up and from time to time revised by the Commission in accordance with Section 6(3) of the Act are observed in the provision of the Channel 4 Service;
 - (d) due responsibility is exercised with respect to the content of any of the programmes included in the Channel 4 Service which are religious programmes, and that in particular any such programmes do not involve:
 - (i) any improper exploitation of any susceptibilities of those watching such programmes; or
 - (ii) any abusive treatment of the religious views and beliefs of those belonging to a particular religion or religious denomination;
 - (e) programmes in the Channel 4 Service do not include any technical device which, by using images of very brief duration or by any other means, exploits the possibility of conveying a message to, or otherwise influencing the minds of, persons watching the programmes without their being aware, or fully aware, of what has occurred; and
 - (f) there are excluded from the programmes included in the Channel 4 Service all expressions of the views and opinions of the Corporation on matters (other than the provision of programme services) which are of political or industrial controversy or relate to current public policy.
- (2) (a) The Corporation shall comply with the Conditions set out in Part II of the Annex (as varied from time to time in accordance with Condition 23) and, subject and without prejudice to such Conditions, shall ensure that the Channel 4 Service is provided in a manner which is consistent with the aims and principles set out in the Statement of Programme Policy.

(b) The Corporation may from time to time review the Statement of Programme Policy and notify the Commission of any amendments which, in the opinion of the Corporation, it would be appropriate to make to the Statement of Programme Policy in the interests, inter alia, of complying with the requirements set out in paragraphs (a) and (b) of Section 25(1) of the Act and ensuring that the Channel 4 Service has a distinctive character of its own.

(c) The Commission may (but shall not be obliged to) make any or all of such amendments to the Licence by a notice served on the Corporation.

- (3) The Corporation shall ensure that the provisions of the Programme Code are observed in the provision of the Channel 4 Service.
- (4) The Corporation shall not be involved in the making of programmes to be broadcast on Channel 4 except to such extent as the Commission may allow. In this Condition 6(4) "programme" does not include an advertisement.

7. Schools programmes

(1) The Corporation shall:-

(a) produce, acquire from other persons, or finance the production of, such number of hours of schools programmes per annum as the Commission shall specify;

(b) include in the Channel 4 Service at least 330 hours per annum of schools programmes (excluding presentation links), to be broadcast in term time or within normal school hours (as the Commission may agree);

(c) provide such material for use in connection with any schools programmes included in the Channel 4 Service as may be necessary to secure that effective use is made of those programmes for educational purposes in schools; and

(d) from time to time consult such bodies or other persons who are concerned with, or have an interest in, schools or the production of schools programmes as the Commission shall from time to time specify.

- (2) The Corporation shall ensure that any schools programmes included in the Channel 4 Service are of high quality and are suitable to meet the needs of schools in the area or areas in the United Kingdom, the Bailiwicks of Jersey and Guernsey and the Isle of Man for which Channel 4 is provided.

8. Party political broadcasts

The Corporation shall include in the Channel 4 Service party political broadcasts in accordance with such rules as the Commission may from time to time determine including without limitation rules with regard to the political parties on behalf of which such broadcasts may be made and the length and frequency of such broadcasts.

9. Programme schedules

(1) The Corporation shall include in the Channel 4 Service such announcements as the Commission may determine concerning programme schedules for programmes to be broadcast in any Channel 3 service.

(2) The Corporation shall:-

(a) provide the Welsh Authority with programme schedules for the programmes to be included in the Channel 4 Service, including information as to the periods available for the broadcasting of advertisements, far enough in advance to enable the Welsh Authority to comply with its obligations under Section 57(3) of the Act; and

(b) provide the Welsh Authority (free of charge) with any programmes which are required by the Authority for the purpose of complying with such obligations.

10. Listed Events

(1) For so long as the Channel 4 Service is provided without any charge being made for the reception of the programmes included in the Channel 4 Service, the Corporation shall not include within the Channel 4 Service (the "**first service**") live coverage of the whole or any part of a listed event without the previous consent of the Commission unless:

(a) another person who is providing a service falling within Section 98(1)(b) of the 1996 Act (the "**second service**") has acquired the right to include in the second service live coverage of the whole of the event or of that part of the event; and

(b) the area for which the second service is provided consists of or includes the whole, or substantially the whole, of the area for which the first service is provided.

(2) If and for so long as any charge is made for the reception of programmes included in the Channel 4 Service, Condition 10(1) shall have effect as if the reference in sub-paragraph (a) to Section 98(1)(b) was a reference to Section 98(1)(a).

(3) Condition 10(1) and 10(2) shall not apply where:

- (a) the Corporation is exercising rights acquired before 1st October, 1996; and
 - (b) the Corporation is exercising rights acquired in relation to an event listed after 1st October, 1996 where such rights were acquired before the date referred to in Section 97(5)(a) of the 1996 Act.
- (4) For the purposes of this Condition 10:
- (a) a listed event is a sporting or other event of national interest which is for the time being included in the list drawn up and published by the Secretary of State for the purposes of Part IV of the 1996 Act;
 - (b) the circumstances in which the televising of listed events generally, or of a particular listed event, is, or is not, to be treated as live for the purposes of Part IV of the 1996 Act shall be determined in accordance with the Code on Sports and other Listed Events.

11. Advertising and sponsorship standards and requirements

- (1) The Corporation shall ensure that subject to any regulations from time to time made by the Secretary of State in accordance with Section 8(4) of the Act:-
- (a) the Channel 4 Service does not include:
 - (i) any advertisement which is inserted by or on behalf of any body whose objects are wholly or mainly of a political nature; or
 - (ii) any advertisement which is directed towards any political end; or
 - (iii) any advertisement which has any relation to any industrial dispute (other than an advertisement of a public service nature inserted by, or on behalf of, a government department);
 - (b) in the acceptance of any advertisement or advertisements for inclusion in the Channel 4 Service there is no unreasonable discrimination either against or in favour of any particular advertiser; and
 - (c) the Channel 4 Service does not, unless the Commission otherwise agrees in writing, include any programme which is sponsored by a person whose business consists, wholly or mainly, in the manufacture or supply of a product, or in the provision of a service, which the Corporation is prohibited from advertising by virtue of any provision of this Licence, the Act, or the Code of Advertising and Sponsorship,

Provided that nothing in this Condition 11(1) shall prevent the inclusion in the Channel 4 Service of any party political broadcast which complies with the rules referred to in Condition 8.

- (2) The Corporation shall comply with all directions, whether general or specific and whether qualified or unqualified, given to it by the Commission with regard to advertisements or methods of advertising or sponsorship, including but without limitation, directions with respect to:
- (a) the classes and descriptions of advertisements and methods of advertising or sponsorship to be excluded, or to be excluded in particular circumstances;
 - (b) the exclusion of a particular advertisement, or its exclusion in particular circumstances; and
 - (c) the times when advertisements are to be allowed, including without limitation directions in relation to:
 - (i) the maximum amount of time to be given over to advertisements in any hour or other period;
 - (ii) the minimum interval which must elapse between any two periods given over to advertisements and the number of such periods to be allowed in any programme or in any hour or day; and
 - (iii) the exclusion of any advertisement or advertisements from a specified part of the Channel 4 Service,

which directions may make different provision for different parts of the day, different parts of the week, different types of programmes or for other differing circumstances.

- (3) The Corporation shall ensure that the provisions of the Code of Advertising and Sponsorship are observed in the provision of the Channel 4 Service.
- (4) The Corporation shall, if so requested by the Commission, make all necessary arrangements to enable the Commission, or any person authorised by the Commission, to preview, at reasonable times, any particular advertisement or any class of advertisement specified by the Commission and/or the script from which any such advertisement is to be produced Provided that no previewing by the Commission of any advertisement shall imply that the Commission has given its approval thereto, and any advice and/or guidance given to the Corporation by the Commission with regard to any such advertisement shall be without prejudice to the powers and duties of the Commission under the Act.

12. Technical standards and requirements

The Corporation shall use all reasonable endeavours to ensure that the signals carrying the Analogue Channel 4 Service attain high standards in terms of technical quality and reliability throughout so much of England, Scotland, Northern Ireland, the Isle of Man and the Bailiwicks of Jersey and Guernsey as is for the time being reasonably practicable and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) the Corporation shall do all that it can to ensure that the relevant provisions of the Technical Performance Code are observed in all

the operations under its direct control, and by any third parties involved in the provision of programmes included in the Channel 4 Service or in the provision and operation of a system for the Distribution and broadcasting of the Analogue Channel 4 Service.

12A. Transmission Assistance

The Corporation shall provide:

(a) any person providing a digital local delivery service as defined in Section 78A(9) of the Act or a digital diffusion service in pursuance of paragraph 4A of Part III of Schedule 12 to the Act with such assistance as he may reasonably require in relation to the technical arrangements for the re-transmission of the broadcasts of Channel 4 in pursuance of Section 78A of the Act; and

(b) any person providing a diffusion service with such assistance as he may reasonably require in relation to the technical arrangements for the re-transmission of the broadcasts of Channel 4 in pursuance of paragraph 4 of Part III of Schedule 12 to the Act.

13. Provision of Additional Services

- (1) The Commission reserves the right to license under the Act any or all of the spare capacity within the signals carrying the Analogue Channel 4 Service which the Commission determines to be available for the provision of additional services having regard to the need for subtitling to be provided in connection with programmes on Channel 4 and to the need of the Corporation to be able to use part of the signals carrying the Analogue Channel 4 Service for providing services which are ancillary to programmes included in the Channel 4 Service and directly related to their contents or relate to the promotion or listing of such programmes.
- (2) Nothing in this Licence shall authorise the Corporation to broadcast or procure the broadcasting of any picture, sound, test or other signals on the spare capacity referred to in Condition 13(1).
- (3) The Corporation shall grant to any person who holds a licence to provide additional services on the frequency on which the Analogue Channel 4 Service is provided, and to any person authorised by any such person pursuant to Section 49(8) of the Act to provide additional services on that frequency, access to facilities reasonably required by that person for the purposes of, or in connection with, the provision of any such additional services.
- (4) The Corporation shall be entitled to require any person to whom it grants access to facilities in accordance with Condition 13(3) to pay a reasonable charge in respect thereof and the Corporation shall use all reasonable endeavours to agree upon the amount of that charge with such person. Any dispute as to the amount of any such charge shall be determined by the Commission.

14. Provision of information to the Commission

- (1) The Corporation shall furnish to the Commission in such manner and at such times as the Commission may reasonably require such documents, accounts, returns, estimates, reports or other information as the Commission may require for the purpose of exercising the functions assigned to it by or under the Act or the 1996 Act in relation to the Channel 4 Service and in particular (but without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing) : -
 - (a) the Corporation will notify the Commission of any change in the chief executive and other ex officio members of the Corporation holding office pursuant to Section 23(5) of the Act within 28 days of the occurrence of any such change; and
 - (b) the Corporation will forthwith notify the Commission in the event of it becoming aware that any member of the Corporation has any financial or other interest which is likely to affect prejudicially the discharge by him of his functions as a member of the Corporation, and it will procure that each member of the Corporation declares to the Corporation any such interest which he may have.
- (2) The Corporation shall ensure that any person authorised in writing by the Commission is permitted at reasonable times to enter any premises of the Corporation in order to:-
 - (a) inspect, examine, operate or test any equipment on the premises which is used in connection with the provision of the Channel 4 Service; and
 - (b) inspect and examine all statutory books and financial and other business records of the Corporation and to take such copies thereof as may in the opinion of the Commission be necessary or desirable to enable it to discharge its functions under the Act.
- (3) The Corporation shall:-
 - (a) retain or arrange for the retention of a recording in sound and vision of every programme included in the Channel 4 Service for a period of 90 days from the date of first inclusion therein;
 - (b) if so requested by the Commission forthwith produce or arrange for the production to the Commission of any such recording for examination or reproduction; and
 - (c) if so requested by the Commission forthwith produce to the Commission any script or transcript of a programme included in the Channel 4 Service which the Corporation is able to produce to it.
- (4) The Corporation shall within 28 days of being requested to do so provide the Commission with such information as it may require for the purposes of determining or revising the tariff referred to in Condition 3(1).

- (5) The Corporation shall promptly provide the Commission with such information as it may require for the purposes of determining the Corporation's Qualifying Revenue for any year and its Prescribed Minimum Income.
- (6) The Corporation shall supply to the Commission:-
- (a) a copy of the Corporation's annual report and accounts as soon as possible after these have been transmitted to the Secretary of State pursuant to paragraph 13 of Schedule 3 to the Act;
 - (b) half-yearly income and expenditure returns and supplementary annexes in such form and at such times as the Commission shall require;
 - (c) statements of its Qualifying Revenue at monthly intervals and also in respect of each of its entire accounting periods in such form as the Commission shall require;
 - (d) details of any particular advertisement, any class of advertisement, or any sponsored programme which the Commission shall from time to time require, in such form and within such period as the Commission may specify;
 - (e) post-transmission data in relation to the programmes included in the Channel 4 Service, categorised by reference to the "Guidance Note on Programme Definition" issued by the Commission and any subsequent guidance which the Commission may from time to time issue, and covering such information and in such form as the Commission shall specify, such data to be delivered to the Commission as soon after transmission of the programmes to which they relate as the Commission may require;
 - (f)
 - (i) such technical performance data as the Commission shall from time to time specify, at such intervals and in such form as the Commission shall require; and
 - (ii) tapes/recordings of such programmes as the Commission shall from time to time require for the purposes of monitoring the technical performance of the Corporation; and
 - (g) such information as the Commission may reasonably require from time to time to determine the Corporation's compliance with Condition 10 and for the purposes of a determination made by it pursuant to Section 102 of the 1996 Act.
- (7) The Corporation shall inform the Commission when judgment is awarded against it in any court proceedings brought against it in respect of the inclusion in the Channel 4 Service of any defamatory, seditious, blasphemous, or obscene matter, or any matter which constitutes an injurious falsehood, or slander of title, or any tort, or an infringement of any copyright, moral right, right in a performance, design right, registered design, service mark, trademark, letters patent, or other similar monopoly right, or a contravention of the provisions of the Official Secrets

Acts, or of any statutory enactment or regulation for the time being in force, or a criminal offence, or contempt of Court, or breach of Parliamentary privilege.

- (8) The Corporation shall supply the Commission with details of the procedures (and of any revision of such procedures) adopted by it and required to be observed by those involved in providing the Channel 4 Service for the purposes of Condition 19(2).
- (9) The Corporation if so requested by the Commission shall at such intervals and at such times as the Commission shall require attend meetings with the Commission for the purpose of enabling the Commission to conduct periodic reviews of the performance by the Corporation of its obligations under the Licence.

15. Renewal of the Licence

The Commission may renew the Licence on one or more occasions for a period of ten years beginning with the date of renewal.

16. Competition in the provision of licensed services

The Corporation shall:-

- (a) not engage in any practice or enter into any arrangement which is prejudicial to fair and effective competition in the provision of licensed services and services connected with them; and
- (b) comply with any direction from time to time issued by the Commission to the Corporation for the purposes of ensuring fair and effective competition in the provision of licensed services and services connected with them.

For the purposes of this Condition, "licensed services" includes local delivery services.

17. Restrictions on the holding of licences

- (1) The Corporation shall ensure that it does not become a disqualified person in relation to the Licence and shall comply in all respects with the restrictions or requirements imposed on or in relation to it as the holder of the Licence by or under Schedule 2 to the Act.
- (2) The Corporation shall comply with any direction of the Commission requiring it to take, or arrange for the taking of, any steps specified by the Commission for the purposes of complying with the requirements imposed by or under Parts III to V of Schedule 2 to the Act.

18. Compliance

- (1) The Corporation shall comply with any direction given to it by the Commission in respect of any matter, which direction is in the opinion of the Commission appropriate, having regard to any duties which are or may be imposed on it or on the Corporation by or under the Act.
- (2) The Corporation shall adopt procedures and procure that such procedures are observed by those involved in providing the Channel 4 Service for the purposes of ensuring that programmes included in the Channel 4 Service comply in all respects with the provisions of this Licence, the Act, and any codes or guidelines herein or therein referred to (the "Codes" and "Guidelines" respectively). The Corporation shall, without prejudice to the generality of the foregoing, ensure: -
 - (a) that there are sufficient persons amongst those involved in providing the Channel 4 Service and/or programmes included in it who are adequately versed in the requirements of this Licence, the Act, and the Codes and Guidelines and that such persons are able to ensure compliance with such requirements on a day to day basis;
 - (b) that adequate arrangements exist for the immediate implementation of such general and specific directions as may from time to time be given to the Corporation by the Commission;
 - (c) that it is able to ensure that sufficient documentary and other evidence is immediately available in support of any advertising claim and that it has access to independent expert advice for the assessment of medical, scientific and technical advertising claims made on the Channel 4 Service; and
 - (d) that in each department of the Corporation where any of the procedures referred to in this condition are to be implemented the member of staff responsible is of sufficient seniority to ensure immediate action and that issues relating to compliance may be brought where necessary directly before senior management for consideration.

19. Government directions and representations

- (1) The Corporation shall, if so directed by the Commission from time to time: -
 - (a) publish in the Channel 4 Service, at such times as may be specified to the Commission by the Secretary of State or any other Minister of the Crown, such announcement as may be specified by a notice given pursuant to Section 10(1) of the Act, with or without visual images, of any picture, scene or object mentioned in the announcement; or

- (b) refrain from including in the programmes included in the Channel 4 Service any matter or classes of matter specified to the Commission by the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 10(3) of the Act.
- (2) The Corporation may when publishing an announcement in the Channel 4 Service in accordance with Condition 19(1)(a) indicate that the announcement is made in pursuance of a direction by the Commission.
- (3) The Corporation shall comply with all directions given to it by the Commission pursuant to a direction of the Secretary of State for the purpose of enabling Her Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom to give effect to any international obligations of the United Kingdom.
- (4) Where the Commission:-
- (a) has given the Corporation a direction to the effect referred to in Condition 19(1)(b); or
- (b) in consequence of the revocation by the Secretary of State of the notice giving rise to the issuing of such direction, has revoked such a direction,
- or where such a notice has expired, the Corporation may publish in the Channel 4 Service an announcement of the giving or revocation of the direction or of the expiration of the notice, as the case may be.
20. Provision of airtime to the Commission
- The Corporation shall make available to the Commission at no cost to the Commission such airtime at such times as the Commission shall reasonably require for the purpose of publicising its regulatory functions and activities under the Act and the 1996 Act.
21. Complaints received from the public
- (1) (a) The Corporation shall adopt procedures acceptable to the Commission for handling complaints received from the public in respect of programmes included in the Channel 4 Service and shall ensure that such procedures are duly observed.
- (b) Such procedures shall, inter alia, include a requirement that members of the public who complain to the Corporation about programmes included in the Channel 4 Service are to the extent practicable informed that they have the right to refer the matter complained of to the Commission.
- (2) The Corporation shall for a period of two years keep a record of any complaints received from the public in respect of programmes included in the Channel 4

Service and of any response given in relation to any such complaint by the Corporation and shall make such records available to the Commission in writing at such times as the Commission may require.

22. The Broadcasting Standards Commission

- (1) The Corporation shall comply with such directions as may be given to him by the Commission to publish, in such manner, and within such period as may be specified by the BSC in any direction given pursuant to Section 119(2)(b) of the 1996 Act, a summary of any complaint with regard to a programme included in the Channel 4 Service, together with the BSC's findings on the complaint or a summary of such findings and, in the case of a standards complaint, any observations made by the BSC on the complaint or a summary of any such observations. The form and content of any such summary shall be such as may be approved by the BSC.
- (2) References in Condition 22(1) to the publication of any matter shall be references to the publication of that matter without its being accompanied by any observations made by a person other than the BSC and relating to the complaint.
- (3) Where the BSC has given a direction under Section 119(1) in relation to a fairness complaint or a standards complaint and either the Corporation and/or any other person responsible for the making or the provision of the relevant programme has or have taken any supplementary action (interpreted in accordance with Section 120(5) of the 1996 Act) the Corporation shall promptly send to the Commission a report of that action.
- (4)
 - (a) The Corporation shall comply with such directions as may be given to him by the Commission to arrange for the publication (by means of broadcasting or otherwise) of regular announcements publicising the BSC.
 - (b) Any such announcements shall, if so required by the Commission, contain a statement of the difference between fairness complaints and standards complaints.

23. Power of the Commission to vary licence conditions

The Commission may by a notice served on the Corporation vary the Licence provided that the Corporation has been given a reasonable opportunity to make representations to the Commission concerning the proposed variation.

24. Equal opportunities

The Corporation shall:-

(a) make arrangements for promoting, in relation to employment by it, equality of opportunity between men and women and between persons of different racial groups; and

(b) review those arrangements from time to time.

In particular (but without limiting the generality of the foregoing), the Corporation:

(i) shall ensure that no job applicant or employee receives less favourable treatment on the grounds of sex, race, colour, creed, nationality, or ethnic or national origins, or on such grounds is disadvantaged by conditions or requirements which cannot be shown to be justifiable;

(ii) shall review its selection criteria and procedures at regular intervals and will monitor the composition of its workforce and of job applicants and will take action to correct any inequalities which come to its notice; and

(iii) if so requested by the Commission shall at such intervals as the Commission may require provide a statement to the Commission of the action it has taken to give effect to such equal opportunities policy, and the Commission may, at its discretion, make such statement in whole or in part public.

25. Notices

(1) Any notice or notification to be served or given under or in relation to the Licence shall be in writing and may be delivered to the party to be served or sent by first class recorded delivery post at its proper address (as defined in Section 199(4) of the Act) or left at that address.

- (2) Any such notice or notification shall be deemed to have been served:
 - (i) if so delivered or left, at the time of delivery or leaving; or
 - (ii) if so posted, at 10.00 a.m. on the second business day after it was put into the post.
- (3) In proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that delivery was made or that the envelope containing such notice or notification was properly addressed and posted as a prepaid first class recorded delivery letter or was left at the proper address as the case may be.

PART 3

26. Exception and limitation on the Corporation's obligations

The Corporation shall not be in any way responsible for any failure to provide the Channel 4 Service directly or indirectly caused by or arising from any circumstances beyond the control of the Corporation including (without limitation) accident or breakdown of any equipment or apparatus (caused otherwise than by the wrongful act, neglect or default of the Corporation, its servants or agents), force majeure, war damage by the Queen's enemies, riot, rebellion, civil commotion, interference by strike, lockout, sit-in, picket or other industrial dispute or action.

PART 427. Sanctions for breaches of Condition

- (1) (a) If the Commission is satisfied that the Corporation has failed to comply with any Condition of the Licence and it has given the Corporation a reasonable opportunity to make representations to it about the matters complained of, the Commission may direct the Corporation to include in the Channel 4 Service a correction or apology (or both) in such form, and at such time or times as the Commission may determine.
- (b) The Corporation may, when including a correction or apology (or both) in the Channel 4 Service in pursuance of a direction from the Commission, announce that it is doing so in pursuance of such a direction.
- (2) The Corporation shall comply with any direction from the Commission not to include in the Channel 4 Service on any future occasion any programme whose inclusion in the Channel 4 Service the Commission is satisfied has involved a failure by the Corporation to comply with any Condition of this Licence.
- (3) (a) If the Commission is satisfied that the Corporation has failed to comply with any Condition of the Licence or with any direction given by the Commission under the Licence and it has given the Corporation a reasonable opportunity of making representations to it about the matters complained of, it may serve on the Corporation a notice requiring it to pay to the Commission, within a specified period, a specified financial penalty.
- (b) The amount of any financial penalty imposed pursuant to Condition 27(3)(a) shall:
- (i) not exceed three per cent. of the Corporation's Qualifying Revenue for its last complete accounting period if such a penalty has not previously been imposed on the Corporation during any period for which the Licence has been in force; and
 - (ii) in any other case, not exceed five per cent. of the Corporation's Qualifying Revenue for its last complete accounting period.
- (c) Where any such penalty is imposed when the Corporation's first complete accounting period falling within the relevant period has not yet ended, such financial penalty shall not exceed three, or (as the case may be) five, per cent. of

the amount which the Commission estimate to be the Corporation's Qualifying Revenue for that accounting period.

(3A) If the Commission:

- (a)
 - (i) is satisfied that the Corporation has failed to comply with Condition 10(1); and
 - (ii) is not satisfied that in all the circumstances it would be unreasonable to expect the Corporation to have complied with that Condition,

it may serve on the Corporation a notice requiring him to pay to the Commission, within a specified period, a specified financial penalty.

(b) If the Commission are satisfied that, in connection with an application for consent under Condition 10(1), the Corporation:-

- (i) has provided the Commission with information which is false in a material particular, or
- (ii) has withheld any material information with the intention of causing the Commission to be misled,

it may serve on the Corporation a notice requiring him to pay to the Commission, within a specified period, a specified financial penalty.

(c) The amount of any financial penalty imposed pursuant to Condition 27(3A)(a) or Condition 27(3A)(b) shall not exceed the amount produced by multiplying the relevant consideration by the prescribed multiplier.

(d) For the purpose of Condition 27(3A)(c):

- (i) the "**relevant consideration**" means an amount determined by the Commission as representing so much of any consideration paid by the Corporation as is attributable to the acquisition of the rights to televise the event in question; and
- (ii) the "**prescribed multiplier**" means such number as the Secretary of State may from time to time by order prescribe under Section 102(4)(b) of the 1996 Act.

- (e) Where any such financial penalty is imposed pursuant to Condition 27(3A), the Commission shall not impose a further penalty under Condition 27(3) in respect of the same circumstances.
- (4) Any exercise by the Commission of its powers under Condition 27(3) shall be without prejudice to the Commission's powers pursuant to Condition 27(1) and 27(2).
- (5) Any exercise by the Commission of its powers under Condition 27(3A) shall be without prejudice to the Commission's powers under Condition 27(1) and (2).

ANNEX

THE CHANNEL 4 SERVICE

PART I

Statement of Programme Policy

Introduction

1. The Channel 4 Service is a national public service television channel transmitting across the whole of the United Kingdom with the exception of Wales where the Welsh language service S4C broadcasts. The Channel 4 Service is broadcast simultaneously in analogue and in digital form (including in Wales). The Corporation also broadcasts digital channels (five at this date, E4 and four FilmFour channels) which are connected with the provision of the Channel 4 Service and are incidental and conducive to the fulfilment of its remit.

Statement of Programme Policy

2. The Statement of Programme Policy is a statement drawn up by the members of the Corporation and approved by the Commission. As provided in the licence, the Corporation may from time to time review the Statement of Programme Policy, in the light of changing circumstances or changes in legislation, and notify the Commission of any amendments which, in the opinion of the Corporation, it would be appropriate to make to the Statement of Programme Policy. The Commission may (but shall not be obliged to) make any or all of such amendments by a notice served on the Corporation.

The Statutory Programme Remit

3. The 1990 Broadcasting Act defines the programme policy in relation to the Channel 4 Service. It says that Channel 4 programmes should “contain a suitable proportion of matter calculated to appeal to tastes and interests not generally catered for by ITV and that innovation and experiment in the form and content of those programmes (should be) encouraged”. It goes on to say that the Channel 4 Service should have a “distinctive character”. It is now recognised that the Corporation is a public service broadcaster with its own culture, history and sense of purpose which also seeks to define its role in a multi-channel environment in relation to all channels and not ITV alone. It provides public service and creative competition for the BBC.

4. The Act requires that the Channel 4 Service is provided as a public service for disseminating information, education and entertainment; that the programmes included in it should be of a high general standard and cover a wide range of subject matter; that a suitable proportion should be of an educational nature; and that sufficient time should be given to quality news and current affairs.

The Purpose of the Channel 4 Service

5. The Channel 4 Service is not expected to be a mass audience channel though some of its programmes will always aim to attract large numbers. It fosters the new and experimental in television. It encourages pluralism, provides a favoured place for the untried and encourages innovation in style, content, perspective and talent on and off screen. Its search for a distinctive character implies different editorial choices at different times since it clearly must take account of what other channels are doing. This provides the chance to introduce new talent, to reaffirm creative alliances or bring together fresh ones, and to develop ideas for which the existing terrestrial services and satellite and cable services cannot find a place. The old verities – experiment, innovation, originality and diversity – should be the touchstones now as they have been in the past.

The provision of programme-related websites and the new digital channels gives the opportunity to broaden and deepen the Channel's engagement with its viewers.

6. While competing for revenue with ITV and Channel 5, the Channel 4 Service is required to cater for tastes and interests not catered for by the other terrestrial channels. This means two things: first, the provision of programmes not available on those channels offering the viewer greater variety in subject matter, in the pursuit of serious themes and in the treatment and length of programmes; secondly, the provision of reasonable choice at accessible times in schedules. The Channel 4 Service should cater for all age groups and should include coverage of international and global issues.

Schools

7. The Channel 4 Service is required by the Act to include "a suitable proportion" of programmes of an educational nature. As part of this obligation the Channel will transmit the 330 hours of schools programmes each year referred to in condition 7(1)(b) of Part 2 of the Licence. Those schools programmes fulfil the needs of the curriculum. They are supported by a full range of appropriate material.

Education

8. A key element of the Channel's programme policy is its diverse range of educational programmes aimed at the general public. The Channel 4 Service devotes on average at least seven hours weekly to its educational output, a substantial proportion transmitted in peak-time. The Channel 4 Service will respond to educational needs as they emerge, in areas such as health, science & technology, and life skills. An important part of this response will lie in finding styles of programming to attract audiences not so far usually drawn to educational programmes. With its commitment to innovation and experiment, Channel 4 will aim to meet the challenge by resourcing and scheduling such programmes effectively. The Corporation provides high-quality support material to accompany a minimum of eight hours per week in total of the Channel's output across the categories of Education, News and Current Affairs and Multicultural.

News and Current Affairs

9. The Act requires the Channel 4 Service to devote "sufficient time" to news and current affairs programmes of high quality. The Channel transmits substantial programmes of national and international news. The programmes report from and deliver coverage and analysis of events in all parts of the United Kingdom and the world and will continue to evolve a distinctive style in the presentation of news and current affairs. The Channel 4 Service as a whole reflects public debate on a wide range of policy issues.

Religion, Faith and Belief

10. The Channel 4 Service is not required by the Act to carry programmes recognisably religious in aim but the Channel includes programmes about religion, faith and belief in peak time and will continue to broadcast approximately one hour a week of this area of output, and looks for distinctive work to enlarge its scope and reach.

Multicultural and Other Groups

11. The Channel 4 Service seeks to portray and reflect the diversity of the UK across its programmes. Within the Channel 4 schedule there are programmes made by and about a wide variety of different groups within the community, whether characterised by their ethnic origin or by cultural or social distinctions. Not less than three hours on average per week of programming are multicultural.

Disability

12. The Corporation is mindful of the needs of those with physical and mental disabilities and recognises that programmes should reflect their lives within the community. Such reflection includes programmes designed for and meeting the particular needs of people with disabilities. The Corporation recognises an obligation to make the Channel 4 Service as a whole more accessible. Requirements for subtitling, signing and audio description are in condition 15 of Part II of the Annex.

Film Investment

13. The Corporation continues to play a role within the UK film industry, developing feature films and nurturing new talent. It is committed to a substantial annual investment in UK feature film production, giving some preference to innovative and risky subjects and treatments.

Landmark Projects

14. As part of its pursuit of a distinctive character the Corporation invests in several seasons and landmark projects of exceptional ambition such as major drama and factual series, arts events and special events each year.

European Origin

15. The Channel 4 Service is subject to the provisions of the Act on the inclusion of a proper proportion of programme material of European origin. The Channel comfortably exceeds the minimum requirement and strives to increase the proportion of European programmes.

Independent Production

16. The Corporation has encouraged and nurtured a large and diverse independent production sector. From its inception it has always obtained a majority of its commissioned programmes from the independent sector. The Corporation therefore expects easily to continue to exceed the statutory requirement that 25 per cent of qualifying programmes in the Channel 4 Service should come from independent producers. Within this it will continue to obtain the programmes for inclusion in the Channel 4 Service from as wide a range of sources as possible.

Original Production

17. The Corporation's programme commissioning policy for the Channel 4 Service is (subject to paragraph 15 above) driven only by the merit of individual programme ideas. One of the great challenges of a multi-channel environment is the maintenance of quality and impact in programmes. In commissioning original programmes, the Corporation seeks to ensure that those programmes have value and purpose. The Corporation will reach a target of at least 60 per cent of total programming that is originated by Channel 4. Within peak time (1800-2230 hours) the Corporation expects that at least 70 per cent of the transmitted hours on the Channel 4 Service will be originated programmes. The Channel shows the broadest and the best of acquired material from around the world.

Production Outside London

18. Channel 4 is a national service. The content of the programmes included in the schedule should reflect life right across the United Kingdom. The Channel also seeks to encourage production based outside London and to develop production talent based in the nations and regions of the United Kingdom. Unlike ITV and the BBC, the Corporation has no regional production infrastructure of its own. Instead the independent production sector and the ITV companies throughout the UK form the principal means of supplying Channel 4 programmes. Nurturing new independent production companies and new talent is a key objective; one which requires a variety of different initiatives including training, development and partnerships in production. The Corporation will originate 30 per cent of UK programmes for the Channel 4 Service by production spend from outside London by 2002. To qualify as regional, programmes must be commissioned from a company with an established production base outside the M25.

First Run

19. The use of repeat material on a minority channel such as the Channel 4 Service can provide a genuine service for viewers by giving them another chance to see something that they may have missed because their lifestyle does not fit in with 'normal' viewing patterns. The Corporation will continue to deploy a strategic repeat policy which is aimed at bringing new audiences to the Channel's programmes. However, the Corporation will ensure that the overall amount of first run material on the Channel 4 Service is more than 60 per cent of total hours and 80 per cent of peak hours.

Development

20. The Corporation recognises that a period of development is important for the creative and production success of programme commissioning and contributes to innovation and experiment. The Corporation devotes substantial resources each year for the development of programme proposals and gives particular emphasis to proposals from outside London.

Archive

21. The Corporation is not required by the Act to make archiving provision. However, it recognises its responsibility and contributes to a national television archive.

Training

22. The Corporation has been at the forefront of efforts, via Skillset, to address the problems of training in an increasingly casualised industry. The Corporation also encourages the development of new talent as well as extending the experience of programme makers informally whilst they make programmes. The Corporation deploys a minimum target of 0.5 per cent of its qualifying revenue towards the purpose of enhancing the training of its own staff, film and television training for the industry, and the development of new talent.

Summary

23. Channel 4 was launched in 1982, with the high ideal that it would contribute to the enlargement of the public's knowledge and experience. That ideal still stands. No one programme or targeted strand is essential for fulfilment of the remit. Its touchstones should be about experiment, innovation, originality and diversity and to these ends the editorial policy must constantly be refreshed and reviewed.
24. The Corporation aspires to be **the** television broadcaster that is most likely to explore new ideas and connect with new ways of thinking. The Channel 4 Service can and should continue to make a contribution to a plural and democratic society.

PART II

Conditions relating to the provision and content of the Channel 4 Service

Interpretation

1. (a) In these conditions unless the context otherwise requires:

"hours/minutes" refers to the number of hours/minutes per week averaged over a calendar year that would be transmitted, measured in "slot times" (that is, including advertising breaks, programme trailers and presentation material during and at the end of programmes) except for material under 10 minutes in length which is measured in "running times" (that is, excluding advertising breaks, programme trailers and presentation material).
- (b) In Condition 2 below, "programme" does not include an advertisement.
2. The Corporation shall ensure that the Channel 4 Service is provided in accordance with the requirements set out below.

General Matters

- (1) The Channel 4 Service shall be provided as a public service for disseminating information, education and entertainment.
- (2) Channel 4 programmes shall contain a suitable proportion of matter calculated to appeal to tastes and interests not generally catered for by Channel 3.
- (3) Innovation and experiment in the form and content of Channel 4 programmes shall be encouraged.
- (4) The Channel 4 Service shall be given a distinctive character of its own.

High General Standard

- (5) Channel 4 programmes shall maintain a high general standard in all respects (and, in particular, in respect of their content and quality).

Diversity

- (6) Channel 4 programmes shall maintain a wide range in their subject matter, having regard both to the programmes as a whole and also to the days of the week on which, and the times of the day at which, the programmes are broadcast. The peak-time schedule will incorporate programmes from a wide range of programme categories, including news, current affairs, education, religion and multicultural. (peak-time is defined as the period 1800-2230 hours each evening.)

Educational Programmes

- (7) Without prejudice to so much of condition 2(1) as relates to the dissemination of education, not less than 7 hours per week of Channel 4 programmes, in addition to the schools programmes referred to in condition 7 of part 2 of the Licence, shall be programmes of an educational nature.

News

- (8) In addition to any news service at breakfast time, not less than 4 hours per week of news programmes which are of high quality shall be included in the Channel 4 service. Such news programme shall be accurate, impartial, authoritative and comprehensive, in terms both of geography and subject matter, and live coverage of important, fast-moving events shall be provided, with news flashes outside regular bulletins as appropriate.

Current Affairs

- (9) Not less than 4 hours per week of current affairs programmes which are of high quality shall be included in the Channel 4 Service.

Programming of European Origin

- (10) The majority of the transmission time on the Channel 4 service (excluding the time reserved to news, sports events, games, advertising and teletext services) in each calendar year of the Licence Period shall be devoted to programming of European origin.

Independent Productions

- (11) In each year not less than 25 per cent (or such other percentage which the Secretary of State may from time to time by order specify pursuant to Section 16(6) of the Act) of the total amount of time allocated to the broadcasting of Qualifying Programmes in the Channel 4 Service is allocated to the broadcasting of a range and diversity of Independent Productions. For these purposes, the reference to a range of Independent Productions shall be interpreted in accordance with Section 16(5)(b) of the Act.

Original Productions and Commissions

- (12) From 1999 at least 60 per cent by time of the programmes included in the licensed service in each calendar year shall be originally produced or commissioned for Channel 4. The requirement for peak-time is 70 per cent.

Production Outside London

- (13) The Corporation shall ensure that in 2002 and any subsequent calendar year at least 30 per cent of its programme budget is allocated to the production of programmes by companies based outside London.

Repeats

- (14) The Corporation shall ensure that from 1999 no more than 40 per cent of programmes transmitted in any calendar year have been previously shown in the same or substantially the same form on Channel 4. The maximum for peak-time is 20 per cent.

Provision for the Deaf and/or Blind and those with Hearing and/or Sight Impairment

- (15) The Corporation shall increase the amount of subtitling each year in order to ensure that from 2004 or earlier at least 80 per cent of programme hours are subtitled. The Corporation will also meet the requirements for sign language and audio description which will apply to the Channel 4 service when it is broadcast in digital form. (These requirements are set out in a code published by the ITC on 14 February 1997. The code also places requirements for subtitling, sign language and audio description on any new programme services which Channel 4 provides on digital terrestrial television.)

Training

- (16) The Corporation shall make suitable arrangements for training or retraining persons employed or to be employed by it together with arrangements for encouraging the training or retraining of persons employed or to be employed by persons providing programmes for inclusion in the Channel 4 service. In making such arrangements the Corporation shall take into account the particular need to increase access to programme-making skills among ethnic minorities and people with disabilities. As from 1998, expenditure in any calendar year shall represent not less than 0.5 per cent of qualifying revenue.

National Television Archive

- (17) The Corporation shall contribute to the maintenance of a national television 18 archive by the body nominated for this purpose by the Commission pursuant to Section 185(2) of the Act. The amount shall be based on the cost to the nominated body of archiving not less than 25 per cent of the Channel's output.

Research

- (18) The Corporation shall carry out research at regular intervals throughout the Licence Period for the purpose of identifying tastes, interests and programme preferences not generally catered for by Channel 3, and shall take the results of such research into account in providing the Channel 4 Service and ensuring that it is given a distinctive character of its own.

PART IV

Statement on New Ventures

1. The Corporation should continue to ensure that any new venture has been subjected to a rigorous review and that:
 - (a) the use of Corporation funds is appropriate and consistent with the provisions of the Broadcasting Acts 1990 and 1996;
 - (b) its business plan offers a reasonable prospect of breaking even on a reasonable timescale and providing a proper return over time on the Corporation's investment, that return being measured either in financial terms or in the form of other benefits delivered to the main channel; and
 - (c) any services, products or rights of the Corporation or of its subsidiaries used by the new ventures are acquired on an arm's length basis and all shared costs are attributed on an equitable basis, having regard to the cost of provision and, where appropriate, comparable market rates.
2. The Commission will expect confirmation of these points from the Corporation as part of any application for any licences to provide new services. Where the Corporation is a minority shareholder in a proposed channel and thus not the licence applicant, the Commission will require a side-letter from the Corporation providing such confirmation.
3. The Corporation will appoint reporting accountants, independent of its auditors, to confirm, with regard to its new ventures, that:
 - (a) the Board has considered business plans which show a reasonable rate of return, as described above, and continued to monitor their performance; and
 - (b) the Corporation has established and applied procedures and controls which provide reasonable assurance that intra group trading is carried out on the basis and with shared costs attributed as described above.

That accountants' report will be published in the Corporation's Annual Report.
