Question 1: Should Chorley FM be permitted to make its proposed changes to the key commitments of Chorley FM, with particular regard to the statutory criteria set out in Section 1 of this consultation document? (Section 106 (1A) of the 1990 Broadcasting Act, as modified by the Community Radio Order 2004).:

- 1) Chorley FM has positive links with LGBT and should continue to do so. Refutes that the current language in the KCs is discriminatory.
- 2) Current KCs already allow for a variety of music, therefore don't need to be changed to widen music being played. .
- 3) LGBT content can be produced no matter of sexual orientation, therefore doesn't matter if people don't identify as such.
- 4) The Changes are likely to lead to a reduction in LGBT output.
- 5) The social gain objectives outline that the station should provide for those otherwise 'underserved'.
- 6) removing a clear target group would impact access for LGBT and youth groups.
- 7) Chorley FM should be increasing youth involvement rather than watering it down.
