Question 1:Do you agree that Ofcom should grant approval to Royal Mail for the Delivery to Neighbour service? If not please explain your answer.:

No. It is significant enough change to how mail is delivered that it MUST be an opt-in change. Also, RM leaving items with a random neighbour of character unknown to me and being able to end their responsibility for delivery of that item there, especially for signed-for items, is completely unacceptable. No other courier or delivery firm is allowed to leave items with a neighbour and shirk further responsibility for the item and there is no reason why Royal Mail should enjoy this irresponsibility either.

Not clear how flats which share one mailbox and one front door are supposed to opt out. Does one sticker speak for all the flats sharing that mailbox? Should each flat display their own sticker?
