

Aircraft radio licence application form – OfW585

Guidance for completing this form

Who should use this form?

You may use this form to apply, amend or surrender one of the following aircraft licences:

- Approved maximum take-off weight of not more than 3,200 kg;
- Approved maximum take-off weight of more than 3,200 kg but not more than 14,000 kg;
- Approved maximum take-off weight of more than 14,000 kg.

Additionally, you can also apply an aircraft licence for:

- Transportable Radio for use on aircraft

Unmanned Airborne Vehicles ('drones')

The Transportable Licence may also be used to authorise the installation and use of Electronic Conspicuity Devices (ECD) on Unmanned Airborne Vehicles (UAVs). This is the only equipment that may be used on a UAV under the Transportable Licence. The ECD must be programmed with a 24-bit International Civil Aviation Organization (ICAO) identity code.

Conditions

Under the Wireless Telegraphy Act 2006, you must have a licence issued by Ofcom before you establish or use any aeronautical radio transmission equipment on board an aircraft.

Communication preference

Where possible, all correspondence will be sent to licensees electronically.

If you do not wish to receive documents electronically, you must opt out by ticking the box against each contact.

All fields are mandatory unless stated otherwise.

Important

When making a new application, you are advised not to commit to the purchase of the equipment until you have received your licence documentation.

We make regulations, which set out the fees for licences to use equipment issued under the Wireless Telegraphy Act. Additionally, information can be found on the Ofcom website detailing how to calculate your licence fee.

Radio interference

Since the operation of a new system may cause interference to existing users, your supplier may consider it necessary to carry out compatibility tests before you apply for your licence. Once installed and operating, your system must not cause undue interference to any other wireless telegraphy equipment. If it does, you may need to stop operating until the cause of the interference has been rectified. Ofcom cannot offer any protection against interference radiated by other authorised services, or by industrial, scientific and medical equipment; however, if you do experience interference, please contact us.

Syndicate membership

Syndicates are asked to provide a list of syndicate members, as a licence shall remain valid for as long as there is a member of the syndicate in the group who was a member at the time the licence was issued. In the event all the listed members leave the syndicate the licence will be deemed invalid and a new licence will be required. Syndicates are asked to advise Ofcom and CAA of any changes to this listing. Failure to notify a change may impact on the validity of the licence.

Changes

This Licence may not be transferred between licensees, legal entities or aircraft. The Licensee must give prior or immediate notice to Ofcom in writing of any change in the details of the licensee name and/or address using the contact details on page 1.

Fees

The Licensee must pay to Ofcom the relevant fee as provided in section 12 of the Wireless Telegraphy Act and the Regulations made thereunder:

- a. on or before the date of issue of this Licence, and/or
- b. on or before the fee payment date, or on or before such dates as shall be notified in writing to the Licensee, failing which Ofcom may revoke this Licence.

Aircraft licences are valid for 36 months. Temporary licences will attract a fee of one 36th of the full fee for each or part month, subject to a minimum fee of £20.

Short-term licences are not available for aircraft less than £3,200 kg or for Transportable licences.

Licence fees exceeding £20 will be rounded up to the nearest pound. The licence fees for 36 months are:

- £20 for each aircraft with an approved maximum take-off weight of not more than 3,200 kg;
- £150 for each aircraft with an approved maximum take-off weight of more than 3,200 kg but not more than 14,000 kg;
- £350 for each aircraft with an approved maximum take-off weight of more than 14,000 kg;
- £15 for a transportable radio.

Radio equipment use and airworthiness

Equipment shall comply with the necessary enforceable airworthiness directives and regulations issued by:

- European Aviation Safety Agency;
- Federal Aviation Administration; or
- Civil Aviation Authority

The Licensee must ensure that the Radio Equipment is constructed and used only in accordance with the provisions specified in the licence. Any proposal to amend any detail specified in the schedule(s) must be agreed with Ofcom in advance and implemented only after this licence has been varied and/or reissued accordingly.

The licensee must possess a valid Flight Radio Telephony Operations Licence (FRTOL) issued by the CAA or be under the supervision of someone who possesses a FRTOL.

The Licensee must ensure that the Radio Equipment is used only by persons who have been authorised by the Licensee to do so and that such persons are made aware of, and of the requirements to comply with, the terms of this Licence.

Access and Inspection

The Licensee shall permit representatives of Ofcom:

- a. to have access to the Radio Equipment; and
- b. to inspect this Licence and the Radio Equipment at all reasonable times (or when, in the opinion of Ofcom, an urgent situation exists, at any time) for verifying compliance with the terms of this licence.

The remainder of these guidance notes provide guidance on customer details in Section B.

Question B1 – Existing customers

If you already hold an Ofcom radio licence, you should write your customer reference number in the box provided. Your customer reference number will be quoted in licence documentation or correspondence that we have previously sent to you.

Question B2 – New customers

A Wireless Telegraphy Act licence can only be issued to a legal entity. You should tick one of the options provided.

Question B3 – Licensee name and address

If you are applying on behalf of a Limited Company, a Public Limited Company or a Registered Charity, the registered address of the organisation must be used.

Question B4 – Licence contact name and address
