I do not wish to be included in proposed "Out and About" scheme.

It appears that I have to take action to refuse, plus I have to place a sticker on my door to indicate my refusal.

I have always got on well with my neighbours and accepted parcels on their behalf, they likewise, however people move house and for all I know may not get on with new people and do not wish to advertise the fact by placing a sticker on my door refusing to accept neighbours post. (nor upset the neighbours – later addition)

I am not happy with the proposal and hope the regulatory authority turns down said proposal in it's current form, just leave it as it is - - Or there is an alternative – see following paragraph.

There is another way, the technology exists and is already in use by Royal Mail. Most delivery services carry a hand held computer needed when a signature is required. How difficult would it be to load this with addresses and shall we call it "Cooperative neighbours" so when the Post Man/Woman cannot deliver the post or parcel they check their computer for an alternative delivery address (I refer here to a neighbouring house)?
