The purpose of this form

- 1.1 You should complete this form if you are applying for a Community Digital Sound Programme (C-DSP) licence.
- 1.2 A digital sound programme service intended for broadcast by means of a local or small-scale radio multiplex service requires either a C-DSP licence or a local DSP licence. Ofcom's published guidance notes set out some of the key issues that potential applicants need to consider in deciding which type of licence is suitable for them. In summary, C-DSP services are not run for financial gain and are required to provide social gain. C-DSP licences therefore include strict conditions to ensure that happens and provide less flexibility than a local DSP licence. However, they do provide access to capacity that small-scale radio multiplex service providers are required to reserve solely for C-DSP services.
- 1.3 A C-DSP licence will be required even if the same programme service is also provided on any other platforms (e.g. FM, satellite), as separate licences are required for those.
- 1.4 As noted above, small-scale radio multiplex services will have reserved capacity for C-DSP services. Issue of a C-DSP licence does not, however, guarantee carriage on a small-scale (or local) radio multiplex service. That is a matter for agreement between the C-DSP licensee and the multiplex service provider, and there may be more C-DSP licences issued in a locality than there are reserved slots on the small-scale radio multiplex service. Note that a C-DSP service does not necessarily have to broadcast using reserved capacity. It can use unreserved capacity on a small-scale radio multiplex service or capacity on a local radio multiplex service, again subject to agreement with the multiplex service provider.
- 1.5 An application for a C-DSP licence will be accepted only once Ofcom has advertised the licence for the small-scale radio multiplex service upon which the proposed C-DSP service is intended to be provided. There is no closing-date by which an application for a C-DSP licence must be submitted (i.e. it can be submitted at any time after the licence for the relevant small-scale radio multiplex licence has been advertised).

- 1.7 Ofcom requires complete and accurate information to assess applications. The target community of the service is that of people living within the Ofcom licence area polygon of the Edinburgh small-scale DAB digital radio multiplex.

The target community includes older people living alone, residential care homes, residents of sheltered housing, hospitals, veterans and former service people within the area including those supported by Erskine Veterans Care Homes, situated at 468 Gilmerton Road, Edinburgh EH17 7SA where Quality Radio will have its studio base.

The target community also includes family and friends of those in care, hospital and requiring health and wellbeing information and advice.

Quality Radio will have at least two weekly programmes for Veterans, plus daily information, a specific Hospital Radio programme, general community request programmes for those living alone, sheltered housing complexes, and care homes. Support features for people that require nursing needs and for people living with dementia. There will information bulletins from NHS Lothian across the broadcast day. Quality Radio has a focus on the quality of life for people with life changing circumstances from living alone to those with wellbeing and mental health issues.

3.6 How will you ensure that your proposed C-DSP service is run on a not-for-profit basis? The legal entity, Paisley FM (2017) Limited is a company limited by guarantee and without share capital and run on a not-for-profit basis without shareholders.

Paisley FM is also a registered charity with the Office of the Scottish Charity Regulator (OSCR). Paisley FM charity registration number: SC049193. Registered on 3 April 2019.

Arrangements are in place as per the Ofcom Community Radio analogue licence for delivery of social gain objectives.

The service provides a range of community benefits (social gain objectives man-dated by statute) for the target community, both on-air and off-air, and in doing so, achieves the following objectives:

Provision of a platform for local community groups, churches, charity groups and societies to promote their events and organisations through us both on air, our website and on social media. We are also keen to get involved with community charities and events.

Promoting and supporting health and welling together with mental health awareness to the community.

- the facilitation of discussion and the expression of opinion;
- the provision (whether by means of programmes included in the service or otherwise) of education or training to individuals not employed by the person providing the service; and
- the better understanding of the particular community and the strengthening of links within it.

Members of the target community contribute to the operation and management of the service.

Quality Radio has mechanisms in place to ensure it is accountable to its target community.

Recent examples of community benefit include social action activity:

The service has these weekly features: Health Matters with a Health Centre Practice Nurse on topical health issues, help and advice. Citizens Advice Bureau with advice and information on a range of topics. Legal Matters with a firm of solicitors and a Social Media expert.

Partnerships with Mental Health and wellbeing charities, Erskine Veterans Homes, and the NHS in the Edinburgh area (NHS Lothian).

Anyone in the target community can apply to join us and will be offered extensive training on all of the broadcasting equipment as well as the opportunity to sit in on existing output to see how it all works and have the chance to speak with current members.

Onsite training at the studio base at Erskine Care Home Edinburgh will be provided in the use of the Myriad5 range of tools available for broadcast purposes. This will be a mix of informal training sessions and a more formal certified training session for key users.

Quality Radio has experience of delivering a better understanding of the target audience through the partnership activity with Erskine Veterans Homes, a registered charity with OSCR. Erskine has been caring for veterans since 1916 and is Scotland's largest veterans' charity, which has annual income of £27.5m (source: OSCR).

We want to take part in as many community activities whether it be working with local artists, churches, charities, City of Edinburgh Council, community or business groups.

To emphasise that we are run by, and require, volunteers we intend to undertake outside broadcasts across the transmission area which will highlight our commitment to Edinburgh. Some of these broadcasts will take place from local events giving them a voice and a platform to a greater audience.

We will be developing links with local colleges and schools to involve young people in the station. We have experience of journalism and media students from Edinburgh Napier University.

Accountability

3.13 How will members of your target community contact your service and influence its operation? **Answer in fewer than 300 words**.

Members of the target community, and indeed all listeners, can make contact with our service, Quality Radio, by using traditional methods of email and social media to include a Facebook page, Twitter page and Instagram page. There will also be a dedicated What's App easy to remember and use contact number.

Good practice is regular surveys on the service delivered and how listeners and users can influence the operation. We would intend to have a survey on Quality Radio within six months of the start of the service.

Through our partnerships with Erskine Veterans Care Homes, Greater Glasgow & Clyde Health Board and NHS Lothian communications teams, Social Services and Residential Homes, we have constant communication on the service and how the service can be improved.

Any suggestions, and importantly, criticisms from listeners and members of the target audience will be considered at monthly management meetings.

Presenter and producer 1-2-1s are on a quarterly rota basis.

All volunteer staff are provided with Compliance Procedures during induction when joining the service.

All staff and volunteers are included in compliance training as are regular guests.

All presenters and producers do get training on the Ofcom Broadcasting Code and therefore are aware of the required standards.

The system that we have in place include a briefing to a 'live' guest depending on the subject matter, whither it is contentious or not.

The Q&As (Questions and Answers) of a typical interview are set in advance, and usually, from a local government council authority they tend to have a written response that the person can relate to.

Should, for any reason, a non-compliant speech or item be broadcast live on-air, it will be immediately referenced during the broadcast and the appropriate response will be provided on-air with reference to a section of the Ofcom Broadcasting Code.

The policy is to avoid such a situation. However, we have a policy in position should the matter arise.

Pre-recorded programmes from a third part producer/presenter are as far as possible checked, however, should a producer have any concerns, our experience indicates that the service provider highlights a song, or song content or presenter introduction of the song in advance giving fair warning.

Depending on the content, it could be deleted from the broadcast programme.

Ongoing compliance is monitored monthly to ensure features and speech items are schedule and output per the schedule.

Speech and guests are sometimes booked in advance, and that is also considered with Key Commitment compliance.

The Compliance Officer will have this responsibility and for monitoring compliance.

Monitoring is an ongoing issue and certainly reviewed monthly.

Information published on the station website or on the Facebook page, would be more than likely be an apology for any possible infringement of the Broadcasting Code.
