

Service name change

Application form to change the name of an existing Television Licensable Content Service (TLCS), Digital Television Programme Service (DTPS) or Digital Television Additional Service (DTAS) licence

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1. Overview

The purpose of this form

- 1.1 You should complete this form if you are applying to change the service name of an existing Television Licensable Content Service (TLCS), Digital Television Programme Service (DTPS) or Digital Television Additional Service (DTAS) licence.
- 1.2 This form should **not** be used if the proposed change would also involve a change to:
 - the target audience of the service;
 - where the service will be received;
 - the language of the broadcast;
 - the type of service (i.e. whether editorial, self-promotional or teleshopping);
 - the genres included in the service;

or any other changes that would involve the service description or any other information in the Annex of the current licence being varied.

Instead, licensees should complete the <u>TLCS variation form</u> and/or <u>DTPS/DTAS variation</u> form.

1.3 Licensees can use this form to request multiple service name changes, expanding the boxes as needed.

How to complete the form

- 1.4 Please download this form and fill it in on a computer. If completing by hand, please use block capitals and black ink.
- 1.5 Of com will reject applications made using an old version of the form.
- 1.6 Of com will accept handwritten application forms but they must be filled in using block capitals and black ink.
- **1.7** Of com will reject application forms that are illegible.
- 1.8 You must answer all questions in the application form and respond "N/A" to any questions that do not apply to the applicant.
- 1.9 Of com will reject applications which do not meet the following criteria:
 - The declaration in Section 3 of this form must be signed and dated.
 - The person who signs and makes the declaration on behalf of the applicant must be:
 - i) A director of the company or the company secretary where the applicant is a company.
 - ii) A designated member where the applicant is a Limited Liability Partnership.
 - iii) A partner, where the applicant is a partnership.

- iv) A member of the organisation's governing body where the applicant is an unincorporated body or association.
- v) The individual who will be the licensee where the applicant is an individual.
- 1.10 If you are completing the form as an agent, i.e. you are acting on the applicant's behalf, please note that you cannot sign it on your client's behalf, and that the person signing the form needs to have personally checked the truth and completeness of the responses given. If your client wishes you to be Ofcom's main contact in relation to the application, please make this clear in an accompanying letter, and provide evidence of your authority to act on behalf of the applicant. The form should be filled in so as to include information about the applicant, not the agent. If Ofcom has further questions once the application has been submitted, we will direct these to the applicant, not to the agent, but we will accept responses from the agent.

How to submit the form

- 1.11 We prefer application forms and required supporting documents to be submitted by email to broadcast.licensing@ofcom.org.uk. Handwritten applications and required supporting documents should be scanned and attached to the email.
- 1.1 You should receive an auto-response from <u>broadcast.licensing@ofcom.org.uk</u> confirming that your application has been received by Ofcom. If you do not receive a response, it is likely your application has not been received and you should leave a voicemail for the Broadcast Licensing team on 020 7981 3002 who will look into this and contact you.

Application fee

1.13 No application fee is payable.

Provision of information

1.14 Of com requires complete and accurate information to assess applications. This is so that we can assess your application against statutory criteria, consider whether those involved licensee are 'fit and proper' to hold a licence, and determine whether their involvement with other organisations disqualifies them from participation in a licence.

1.15 It is an offence under the Broadcasting Act 1996 (as amended) to provide false information or withhold relevant information during the application process, and may be grounds for revocation of a licence subsequently granted.

Publication of information about applications and licensed services

- 1.16 When a licence is varied, the name of the service and public contact details for the licensee are published on the Ofcom website. These are the details supplied by the licensee in the application form. If you have any questions about the information that we publish, or there are any changes to this information, you should contact the Broadcast Licensing team by email (broadcast.licensing@ofcom.org.uk).
- 1.17 Of com considers issued TLCS, DTPS and DTAS licences to be public documents and copies of licences will be made available to third parties on request.
- 1.18 Of com publishes a <u>monthly update</u> which lists new services licensed, licences revoked, licence transfers, and changes to the name or nature of the licensed service during the past month.

Data protection

1.19 We require the information requested in this form in order to carry out our licensing duties under the Broadcasting Act 1990, Broadcasting Act 1996 and Communications Act 2003. Please see <u>Ofcom's General Privacy Statement</u> for further information about how Ofcom handles your personal information and your corresponding rights.

- 1.20 We strongly recommend that the appropriate person at the applicant, signs up to receive Ofcom's regular email updates on broadcasting matters including notification when the Broadcast and On Demand Bulletin is published.
