The service provides original output for a minimum of 10 hours per day	The service provides original output for a minimum of 56 hours per week.	We would like to move from a daily minimum, to a weekly average. This to better reflect the volunteer commitment and available resources. At present periods of unexpected absence due to health, family or work related issues could have a direct impact on our original content on a daily basis. Proposed changes would enable us to ensure our weekly commitment was met. Request is also to slightly reduce the total hours to be in line with an average of 8 hours per day. The impacts of the pandemic and cost of living crisis are now being felt, whilst able to maintain core volunteer numbers, the amount of time they can dedicate is lower. We've also lost some longstanding presenters due to age/health issues, and whilst recruitment is ongoing and new presenters are coming through – training
		takes time, and their availability is not at

	the same level. Effectively losing one presenter (retiree) able to commit to 5-10 hours a week on-air and original content, to one new presenter (working) able to commit to 2 hours per week will inevitably create a shortfall in the short term. Proposed minimum would reflect the challenges are volunteers are experiencing, and enable key commitments to be met in full, and then over deliver on original output

No – Character of service would remain, change would allow greater flexibility in scheduling of original content. Programming could be delivered based on availability of volunteers, rather than trying to reach daily minimum

No - We do not believe that these changes would narrow the range of programmes available, if anything this would strengthen the content available. The station is clearly demonstrating increased partnerships with local stakeholders and delivering stronger local content. This can be evidenced with success across Community Radio Awards and Local Business Awards underpinned by Community Partnership-based programming. These changes would enable the station to deliver this content and meet key commitments

(c) Do you believe that there is evidence that, amongst persons comprising that community, there is a significant demand for, or significant support for, the changes that you have proposed?

N/A Changes would not be noticeable to the audience, original output would remain strong and diverse with the station still broadcasting 24 hours per day. This request is for an amendment to our minimum delivery, with the station looking to exceed this and, as such, over deliver.

No – As above, changes would enable volunteer time to recruit and train new members, increase community engagement and involvement, increase community access and thus, enable the increased creation of stronger local content.

Ofcom notes on the request

The request was AGREED, because Ofcom was satisfied in relation to Section 106(1A)(a) of the Broadcasting Act 1990 (as modified by the Community Radio Order 2004, and further modified by the Community Radio (Amendment) Orders 2010 and 2015) i.e. that the change would not substantially alter the character of the service, and for the policy reasons given below.

The Licensee is requesting to convert its Key Commitment on original output from a daily to a weekly requirement. The change from 10 hours per day to 56 hours per week would also represent a moderate reduction of 20% of its original output requirement. In requesting this change, the Licensee has stated that it reflects a reduction in available volunteer hours, and will allow for the training of new volunteers on the service. By doing this, the Licensee has stated that it will be able to extend community access to the service.

Ofcom is satisfied that this change will not substantially alter the nature of the character of the programme service provided by K107fm, and the change will not impact on the Licensee's ability to deliver the on-air service and its off-air social gain commitments. In fact, the change could improve the Licensee's delivery of its social gain commitments by allowing for more time to be devoted to training. The change represents a modest reduction to original output, and we do not expect that this reduction would represent a substantial change to the character of service, or the on-air service delivered to listeners.

In terms of our policy criteria, Ofcom is satisfied the change will not affect the station's ability to meet the community radio 'characteristics of service' set out in the legislation, and there are no other policy reasons to refuse the change. We have therefore decided to exercise our discretion to approve this change.
