# Q1 Do you agree with Ofcom's view that the proposed non-emergency healthcare service represents a justified use of a three-digit number? Please give reasons for your views. : 

Yes. A three digit number is easy to remember, easy to look up if not known, and easy to dial.

## Q2 Do you agree with the DHs view that:

A) a three-digit number is the best choice for the proposed service and B) of the three-digit numbers available, 111 is the best option?

## Please give reasons for your views. :

A) Yes. A three digit number is easy to remember, easy to look up if not known, and easy to dial.
B) Partially. A number with the same three digits is easier to remember and use. The number 111 may be thought related to the normal emergency number 999, so may be more memorable.

## Q3 What are your views on the tariff options selected by the DH? :

I believe that the tariff should have a fixed maximum limit for each type of service provider (e.g. land-lines or mobiles). A reasonable level would deter mischievous calls without penalising genuine callers.

Q4 Do you have any comments on the proposed notification of modification to the Numbering Condition in Annex 8 of this document :

I am puzzled: this document is an on-line form and does not have an Annex 8. The Ofcom consultation document does have an Annex 8, but that merely gives notification of a proposal that the number 101 be added to the list of special numbers in General Condition 17 of the Act.
