I went to my local delivery office today where I noticed two signs giving the opening times.

These said that Monday to Friday the hours are 07.30 - 12.15 and on Saturday 07.30 to 10.30.

However the P739 cards say that on a Wednesday the hours are 7.30am - 8pm and on a Saturday 7.30am - 2pm.

I assume that the P739 times are correct and certainly offer a better service than the times on the signs.

Why then have the signs not been removed, replaced, amended or covered over?

Is there an ulterior motive I wonder?

Could the plan be to bring back the old opening times if the 'Deliver to neighbour' scheme goes ahead?

Or could the plan be to close the office altogether?
