Freedom of Information: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information where you asked about the number of licensed amateur radio operators by call sign prefix and gender.

This was received by Ofcom on 3 August and it has been considered under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

You asked:

With reference to your recent response to an enquiry regarding the "Number of licenced amateur radio operators" which was broken down by callsign prefix, I would like an additional breakdown of those figures by gender.

Please see below a table which has been broken down by call sign prefix, by gender alongside the number of licensed amateur radio operators.

If you are unhappy with the response or level of service you have received in relation to your request from Ofcom, you may ask for an internal review. If you ask us for an internal review of our decision, it will be treated as a formal complaint and will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will acknowledge the complaint and inform you of the date by which you might expect to be told the outcome.

The following outcomes are possible:

- the original decision is upheld; or
- the original decision is reversed or modified.

Timing

If you wish to exercise your right to an internal review **you should contact us within two months of the date of this letter**. There is no statutory deadline for undertaking internal reviews and it will depend upon the complexity of the case. However, we aim to conclude all such reviews within 20 working days, and up to 40 working days in exceptional cases. We will keep you informed of the progress of any such review.
