Additional comments:

Not in full.

The proposals work for standard post, but the benefits of recorded signed for mail (i.e. knowing that an item has been received by the addressee) are lost if the item is allowed to be left with a neighbour.

We often have items that do not need to be delivered the next day, or have a significantly high value, but we do need the guarentee that the item has been delivered to the intended recipient that recorded signed for provides. The proposals will leave us with no option but to utilise Special delivery in these circumstances, at a substantially higher cost.
