Any changes will not substantially change our service but actually enhance our ability to deliver a service that our new audience is asking for. It is vital we look to attract a wider audience and engage in all community groups. We see the proposed changes as feasible and absolutely crucial to our future service.

Our changes will not narrow our range of programs but it will give us a wider range. It will enable us to celebrate all music from the past and present and further develop our relationships with all community groups.

Yes, our research from listeners has shown us that these changes are necessary to ensure the station keeps up to date with its target audience. For example, some of our listeners wish to hear music from the distant past and onwards which will help us to celebrate the roots and history of diverse communities who regularly listen to such music.

We do not think anyone would oppose our changes as these changes are enhancing our station for the community. It would further facilitate access to members of our community who can be a voice for the station, and equally mould how we further improve our training and output, so that we can access areas of the community that may feel unrepresented.

By allowing the proposed changes we feel will have no effect on our social gain but will enhance our standard of output. It will help us to focus on the quality of our output and ensure the sensitivity is afforded to all groups. The quality is essential in delivering on our key commitments.

Market research over the first 12 months of our licence has shown that you cannot predict what your audience want to hear from a new station so, we are now trying to tailor our service to give our new audience what they want from Embrace.

Studying the Dynata Report has helped us greatly as we have sought to understand what our community wants from our service. It has opened up opportunities to work not only with our community but also our colleagues from other radio stations within the town, which can only be a positive.

Ofcom notes on the request

The request was AGREED, because Ofcom was satisfied in relation to Section 106(1A)(a) of the Broadcasting Act 1990 (as modified by the Community Radio Order 2004, and further modified by the Community Radio (Amendment) Orders 2010 and 2015) i.e. that the change would not substantially alter the character of the service, and for the policy reasons given below.

The Licensee is requesting to reduce its Key Commitment on original output from 91 hours per week to 70 hours per week; this change would represent a reduction of 23.1% of its original output requirement, which the Licensee says will allow it to focus on the quality of its output. Ofcom considers this represents a moderate reduction to the Licensee's original output key commitment and therefore, we are satisfied this change does not represent a substantial change to the Licensee's character of service.

Similarly, the Licensee is also requesting to reduce its Key Commitment for locally produced content from 70 hours per week to 42 hours per week, this represents a greater reduction of 40%. The Licensee has stated that this change would allow it to utilise more remote broadcasting. We are satisfied that this change will not substantially alter the character of programme service as the required volumes of original and locally-produced output should enable the station to continue to deliver a service consistent with Embrace Radio's overall character of service.

Finally, the Licensee is requesting to change the wording of its music Key Commitment from "A mix of music from the 70s to today. A variety of music genres, aimed at ethnic minorities and other specific interest groups will be part of specialist shows from 7pm to 10pm" to "A mix of music from the past to the present, with specialist shows aimed at all types of interest groups." The Licensee has pointed to market research as its underpinning rationale for this change, but we do not consider the information provided by the Licensee constitutes clear evidence of support and/or demand for the proposed change. Nevertheless, Ofcom does not consider that this proposed change would substantially alter Embrace Radio's character of service. The Licensee will still need to serve the local population "regardless of ethnicity", and indeed this change may provide the licensee with additional flexibility to better serve its target audience. We also think a revised commitment to broadcast "specialist shows aimed at all types of interest groups" is not much of a change from the current requirement.

In terms of our policy criteria, Ofcom is satisfied the change will not affect the station's ability to meet the community radio 'characteristics of service' set out in the legislation. In particular, Ofcom is satisfied that the proposed changes will not impact the Licensee's ability to deliver a service that is "provided primarily for the good of members of the public, or of communities, and in order to deliver social gain, rather than primarily for commercial reasons or for the financial or other material gain of the individuals involved in providing the service". Under the proposed changes, Embrace Radio will maintain its existing character of service to "serve, regardless of ethnicity, all those who live and work in the Borough of Northampton and whose family life is rooted in the borough of Northampton and its environs." Ofcom is satisfied that the proposed changes will not impede the licensee's ability to serve this audience. For these reasons, we have decided to exercise our discretion to approve this change.
