Additional comments:

Opt out should be via a database (such as opt out of junk mail), not via a sticker on doors, as that can also could cause disputes.

Or at least there should be an opt-in sticker.

Question 1:Do you agree that Ofcom should grant approval to Royal Mail for the Delivery to Neighbour service? If not please explain your answer. :

It should not be taken for granted that neighbours are responsible or friendly. In the case of on going disputes, having to go to a neighbours house to pick up a parcel can cause problems.
