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1. Overview

The board and shareholders of Medway & Swale DAB Ltd represent a breadth of experience and talent across the Medway and Swale communities.

They have wide radio experience - from radio and audio production to technical solutions to multiplex management, across community and commercial radio, working together in a model that's collaborative and supportive.

Sittingbourne Community Radio has been broadcasting in the Swale area for the past 11 years, but has been building contacts and forging close links since their first RSL in 2003

The Directors also have experience and connections through their previous involvement with Medway FM and commercial radio in the Medway towns since 1992, as well as the numerous local groups and charities they have worked with.

Our 11 service providers represent community radio, local services based within Medway and Swale, and commercial services that have developed to service distinct communities. Across our services, a broad range of communities of identity, locality and interest will be 'super' served. Our collaborative approach can only enhance the local communities and give further opportunities to underserved groups going forward.

We also welcome new ideas and initiatives from the numerous smaller local broadcasters in the area that will enhance our offering in the future.

- 1. Deliver a reliable, consistent and high-quality DAB service to as much of the indoor population of the Sittingbourne & the Medway Towns polygon as possible
- 2. Create coverage that is sustainable and affordable to our radio broadcasters both community and commercial
- 3. Achieve this within a sustainable, long-term business plan.

We have used our local connections to secure space for a primary site at Demelza House which covers 130,000 people around Sittingbourne and Sheppey. Our primary site is supplemented by a secondary site at Medway Maritime Hospital



Financial and business plan

3.17 Please provide a high-level estimate of the costs you believe will be required to establish the multiplex service.

Our area

Sittingbourne is a modern market town with historic links and the largest of the three main towns in Swale, with strong transport links to London and the rest of Kent. It has seen significant residential developments in recent years and has a large commuter population. That said, parts of the polygon fall within the 10% most deprived neighbourhoods in England.

The wider Swale municipal area includes the island of Sheppey with its own distinct community. Reached by a bridge over a natural border of sea water, this island in Kent is a community in its own right and is served by two existing FM community radio services.

Medway is a unitary authority district combining Strood, Rochester, Chatham, Gillingham and Rainham. It's one of the South East's most aspiring and developing destinations, marrying its celebrated maritime and cultural heritage with a rapidly emerging continental-style scene. It is the only unitary authority within the wider county of Kent and is home to a significant part of the population of the South East.

The Medway and Swale areas were served by its own ILR sallie service in the 1990's/2000's before that was amalgamated into a wider regional group. Since then community radio has thrived, broadcasting a mix of analogue and internet based services.

Together the polygon area covers multiple distinct towns with thriving community radio services that are popular with local people from all backgrounds and interest groups.

Sittingbourne Community Radio Ltd

SCR has been broadcasting full time to Sittingbourne and the surrounding area of Kent as 106.9 SFM since July 2012, prior to which it operated a number of RSLs. 106.9 SFM currently has 28 volunteers in a variety of roles – the youngest is 17, the oldest is 74 and the team includes several generations from the same family. A number of volunteers are from disadvantaged backgrounds, including mental health issues, physical disabilities, visual and speech impairments and long-term unemployed.

106.9 SFM's main objectives are to offer high quality programming aimed at a wide age range of listeners, and provide a service that is informative and supportive to the local community - raising community spirit and awareness of what's on in and around the area.

SCR is pleased to support this application, contribute as a significant shareholder for its robust setup and operation and provide SFM radio as a service on the multiplex.

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Why DAB?

Small-scale DAB is a great opportunity for the FM community stations in Swale and Medway to continue to serve their existing audience bases, whilst also reaching a wider audience across the area on a new platform. DAB has previously been out of reach in terms of cost and geographical targeting to local people.

Collaborative Partnership

The shareholders started to work together in 2021 making plans to apply for this multiplex. Working together in collaboration as shareholders, the Directors have reached out to all parties who are working in radio across the area. Heads of Terms or expressions of interest have been sought with all the existing Ofcom licenced community radio groups, those currently broadcasting online and other or new service providers who wish to launch services for Medway and Swale. This application brings together local radio and community connections and recognised digital experience for the benefit of everyone.

Our proposal

Our aim is to establish a successful small scale multiplex operation, providing community and commercial broadcasters, established and new, with a reliable digital broadcast platform on both affordable and flexible terms. The board and shareholders have, between them, extensive experience in community radio, local radio and digital radio and particular experience in making new small and medium sized radio projects work.

Low Cost Carriage

Our core ambition is to offer service providers a low cost, easy to access, high quality digital broadcast platform and to ensure its long-term sustainability. To achieve this, we will offer reserved capacity to C-DSP licence holders at a discount to the equivalent rate of unreserved capacity. Carriage fees will be invoiced monthly in advance and increase annually by RPI.

Each service provider will be offered similar carriage contracts, with identical terms and conditions. All will be offered contracts that run to the end of the multiplex licences. We recognise that some service providers may wish to contract for shorter periods and will accommodate such requests. We believe that our chosen tariff structure provides certainty to service providers over their carriage costs throughout the contract and / or licence term.

Promoting the Opportunity

As well as direct communication, we have promoted the new multiplex opportunity via social media and news releases in industry and local press.

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Service Providers

The number of confirmed services gives us confidence in the financial stability of our plans to launch and sustain the multiplex. Several of the proposed service providers have worked with the shareholders before or have a positive experience on existing small-scale DAB trials and / or local multiplexes.

Objectives

We have signed Heads of Terms for 11 services and have ongoing discussions with a number of other potential providers. Under our operating model, Kent Capacity Co has agreed to underwrite capacity fees to ensure the multiplex runs cash positive.

Commitment

The shareholders have come together with a shared long-term commitment to DAB broadcasting, and are committed to investing in the platform to keep abreast of technical developments during the licence term.

Establishment and Running Costs

We anticipate the majority of costs to be related to the build of our transmission site - £36,000. Legal and other administrative costs in pre-launch period are assumed at £6,000 and we have included a 12.5% contingency.

Funding

The company will be funded through a combination of equity and primarily shareholder working capital loans. The shareholders have confirmed their ability to cover this funding.

The Shareholders

Medway & Swale DAB Ltd is a strong applicant group with collaboration at the heart of its ethos:

- **Sittingbourne Community Radio Ltd** Sittingbourne's local community radio station that has been broadcasting since July 2012, but has been garnering support in the area with RSLs as far back as 2003.
- Kent Capacity Co is a collaboration of Kent experienced broadcasters and digital radio multiplex managers. It will market opportunities to broadcast across Kent's small scale DAB multiplexes, sell spare capacity on the multiplex and identify new revenue streams on behalf of Medway & Swale DAB. In addition to representing revenue for the multiplex it will also operate its own DSP service 'Kent!' a wide mix of adult music and What's On Leisure information for Kent.

The combined experience of SCR and KCC as service providers and multiplex operators gives us an excellent understanding of what is required – good coverage, service reliability and easy access for programme providers at an affordable and realistic price.

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Multiplex Management

Medway & Swale DAB has entered into a multiplex management agreement with MuxNet UK who will oversee the build of the multiplex and transmitter network, contracts with service providers, liaison with Ofcom and service providers and oversee day to day multiplex management and service provider liaison ongoing.

MuxNet has substantial digital radio experience in terms of both multiplex build and operation, as well as digital radio services, at the local and small-scale DAB level, and is involved in the Bristol and South Birmingham small-scale multiplexes. They have the required technical competence, operational expertise, financial knowledge and aptitude to manage third party relationships successfully.

MuxNet will be responsible for the launch of the multiplex and its subsequent day to day operation; in particular:

- Overseeing bit rate variations, enhancements or projects required by service providers, such as EPG provision, temporary services and data developments.
- Maximising multiplex functionality and efficiency.

As MD at Create, he is currently working with NHS Kent & Medway and the two local councils in Medway and Swale to bring new healthcare solutions and Covid-19 support to local people. John has worked in radio in Kent for over 35 years and has commercial relationships with local business, community groups and organisations.

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The MuxNet team - Gregory Watson, Nick Piggott and Matt Deegan have been involved in DAB broadcasting since 1999 and the launch of Digital One and the subsequent development of the Now Digital Network.

- Since 2008, Gregory Watson and Matt Deegan, along with colleague Nicky Tate, have successfully built the MuxCo, working with local shareholders to ensure that all broadcasters have opportunities to participate in DAB. Gregory has deep experience of regulatory and business affairs, whilst Matt has been involved with strategic and commercial development of digital radio for many years and leads on commercial opportunities.
- Nick Piggott has extensive experience in digital radio technology. He has been deeply involved with Small Scale DAB trials in several locations, as well as the Open Digital Radio project, and has decades of technical experience of Digital Radio, sitting on the Technical Committee of WorldDAB and contributing to the creation of technical standards and guidance papers.

We intend to launch the Medway & Swale small-scale DAB multiplex within 8 months of approval of our technical plan.

Upon award, we will immediately advance negotiations regarding the proposed transmission sites and liaise with other radio multiplex licensees on any impact our proposed transmitters might have. Once completed, we will seek agreement from Ofcom for the proposed technical plan – mindful that the coverage proposed in our application is an award criterion and that any change will need to deliver broadly equivalent coverage.

We will send final site details to Ofcom for clearance and provide evidence of liaison and agreement with other radio multiplex licensees. Given the time taken to co-ordinate services we recognise the importance getting the final transmitter plans to Ofcom as quickly as possible.

Our timeline then focuses on the following key stages:

- Building and installing the DAB multiplex and transmission chain
- Finalising carriage agreements with the service providers
- Commissioning and testing the transmitter equipment for compliance with Ofcom's Digital Radio Technical Code
- Providing Ofcom with evidence of compliance with the licence and the Digital Radio Technical Code

We have confirmed the availability of all equipment and professional services to meet our timescales.

We will continue to promote opportunities on the multiplex to broaden the range of formats and suppliers on the multiplex.

In approaching prospective programme service providers, we have acted in a manner to ensure fair and effective competition in the provision of community and local digital sound programme services.
