I would like to see Ofcom safeguard consumers calling 084X and 087X numbers. Landline telephone packages that include all local and national calls should include these as that is what they are advertised as. Mobile phone tariffs should include these in the minutes purchased again because they are advertised as no more than a local or national call which is what mobile phone tariffs say they include. And more importantly, the receivers of these calls should absolutely no way receive an income from the cost of these calls, as when they give these numbers to their customers/clients/general public to contact them on, they may mention how much the call may cost, but they never mention that they themselves will receive part of that. I can only see that as theft.
