I do not want to put a sticker on my door to opt out.

I have contacted the Post Office to complain and now i am passing it on to Ofcom.

Question 1:Do you agree that Ofcom should grant approval to Royal Mail for the Delivery to Neighbour service? If not please explain your answer. :

No any mail addressed to me should be delivered to me, that is the law and it should not be changed.

Having to put a sticker on your door to show that you have opted out implies that you are not at home, leaving your home vulnerable to possible break ins. The sticker also gives the impression that you are not very neighbourly and could cause trouble between neighbours.

After contacting the Post Office they told me that if I want to opt out then I must put a sticker on my door. No other choices.
