



BT's comments on Ofcom's consultation paper:

“Re-prioritising BT's remaining Undertakings commitments on information systems separation”

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BT's overall position

BT remains committed to the two key principles which form the basis of its Undertakings: Equivalence of Inputs and Openreach operational separation.

We acknowledge the recognition in this consultation, and Ofcom's 29th May 2009 document *Impact of the Strategic Review of Telecoms*, of the significant achievements made by BT since the Undertakings came into existence in September 2005 and the positive benefits of these for all industry players and their end-user customers.

While remaining committed to the two key principles we believe that it is important that their practical implementation recognises the changing needs of customers, their Communications Provider suppliers, and the rapidly evolving competitive, technology, and economic environment; as well as benefits from the learning obtained from the implementation of the Undertakings to date.

Overall the package of proposals upon which Ofcom is consulting represents a pragmatic approach to the remaining major Undertakings requirements. The amended approach to systems separation recognises the detrimental impact on customer experience which would result from individual product migrations rather than approaching migrations on a customer basis. The approach creates the scope for Openreach to be more responsive to the needs of its Communications Provider customers and their end users through focussing upon delivering an industry agreed set of priorities rather than being driven primarily by regulatory requirements.

Accordingly BT supports fully the proposed variation and exemption agreements and therefore responds in the affirmative to all the specific questions in Ofcom's consultation. We will be committed fully to the successful delivery of the proposals detailed in Ofcom's consultation.
