Question 1:Do you agree that Ofcom should grant approval to Royal Mail for the Delivery to Neighbour service? If not please explain your answer.:

Not if the only way to be opted out is to have to display a sticker visible to the delivery postman/woman which would therefore have to be on my front door, I do not want such an embellishment on my front door, front wall or anywhere visible on my property. I do not want to take in post/parcels for anyone not at my address due to special circumstances due to my disability and having to try to respond to someone at my door which is not easy for me & I only usually open the door for pre-arranged visitors. My property is a period style cottage and the only embellishment I want is the cottage style door and door furniture I already have on my property, and the custom made number &c which I have on my wall. I do not want the stress of my doorbell being rung by a post delivery person. I should be able to opt out of this scheme by registering my address and having that on a database and known to the postman/woman that Royalmail cannot do this at my property, not to only be able to opt out if I display a sticker, that is not acceptable to me.
