Question 1:Do you agree that Ofcom should grant approval to Royal Mail for the Delivery to Neighbour service? If not please explain your answer.:

No. I believe it should be possible to opt in to the scheme rather than having to opt out of it. Many people have neighbour disputes and items could be withheld or disputes could escalate. Neighbours might take exception at having individuals displaying a visable sticker to opt out as it is a sign of mistrust therefore some people might feel they can't opt out. People may be put off ordering if they know neighbours could receive parcels if they are out.
