The total number of complete graduate programme applications were:

2023 – 1,927

2024 – 5,127

2025 – 3,013

2) How many total graduate applications was shortlisted for your assessment day/interviews for 2023, 2024 & 2025?

The total number of candidates invited for Assessment Centres were:

2023 – 188

2024 – 100

2025 – 102

3) How many job offers were given for graduate applicants for 2023, 2024 & 2025?

For each year, the following number of roles were available and recruited for:

2023 – 34

2024 – 26

2025 – 23
