## Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information concerning 1997 Digital Terrestrial Multiplex applications. We received this request on 28 March 2025. We have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

We wrote to you on 29 April 2025 to say we needed more time to consider the public interest in disclosing or withholding the requested minutes. We have now concluded this.

### Your request & our response

1: Any ITC minutes/notes concerning the decision to award the 1997 applications to British Digital Broadcasting plc instead of Digital Television Network (DTN).

Please find attached, alongside this response letter, the ITC board minutes in scope of your request. Please note that we have redacted personal data that we consider is exempt from disclosure under section 40 of the FOI Act and business details that we consider are exempt under section 44 of the FOI Act. Sections 40(2) and 44 are an absolute exemption under the FOI Act and do not require a public interest test.

Under section 44 of the FOI Act, information is exempt from disclosure if its disclosure is prohibited by or under any enactment. In this case, section 393(1) of the Communications Act 2003 (the "Communications Act") prohibits the disclosure of information about a particular business, which we have obtained in the course of exercising a power conferred by, among other legislation, the Communications Act, unless we have the consent of that business or one of the statutory gateways under section 393(2) of the Communications Act is met, neither of which apply here.

Under section 40(2) of the FOI Act, personal information about persons other than the requester is exempt from disclosure where, among other things, its disclosure would contravene any of the data protection principles in the UK General Data Protection Regulation and the Data Protection Act 2018.

# 2: The British Digital Broadcasting application for multiplexes B, C and D. 3: The DTN application for multiplexes B, C and D.

Please find attached the BDB and DTN license applications for multiplexes B, C and D. We have included the Section A, as well as a summary, of each of these applications.

We have redacted any personal names from these applications as we consider this information is exempt from disclosure under section 40 of the FOI Act (as explained above).

### **Request an internal review**
