Thank you for your request for information about Tattle Life website.

We received this request on 16 September 2025 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

Your request and our response

"Please confirm if a meeting in Parliament on the 15th September 2025 was attended by ofcoms director Almudena Lara and an active investigation on Tattle life is being carried out as a result of this meeting. Please confirm Almudena Lara's statement published in the Northern Irelands [Goss.ie](https://goss.ie) stating that ' this site (Tattle Life) is exactly why she chose this job'. Please confirm what information has been passed to Ofcom and the validity of this information in order to conduct an investigation."

We can confirm Almudena Lara attended a meeting in Parliament on 15 September 2025, and we have not opened an investigation into this site. We can confirm some of the information in the article was inaccurate when published. We have asked for this information to be corrected, and the article has since been updated.

Sites in scope of the Online Safety Act are obliged to comply with their duties, and while we are looking into the issues raised, we cannot comment on ongoing operational matters.

Request an internal review

If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
