Thank you for your request for an up-to-date callsigns list.

We received this request on 27 October 2025 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

### Your request

*I am submitting this FoI request in light of the recent licensing changes including the the new M8 and M9 and the availability of all other callsign prefixes online.*

*Please supply a copy of the amateur radio callsign spreadsheet containing the following information fields on each Row:*

- *Callsign*
- *Product (Note this can be either BLANK, Amateur Foundation Radio Licence, Amateur Intermediate Radio Licence, Amateur Full Radio Licence, Amateur Club Radio Licence, Temporary or any other amateur radio Product identifier you may use)*
- *Status (usually Allocated, Reserved, Available or BLANK)*
- *Type (usually Callsign - Amateur)*
- *Last Modified Date*
- *Original Start Date (date licence was first issued to the current holder)*

*Ideally the spreadsheet rows should be sorted into callsign sequence.*

Please note that we do not hold a list of completely new callsigns which have never been previously allocated as our system generates new callsigns on demand. You may apply for a callsign via this link: [Ofcom Licensing services](#).

### **Request an internal review**

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

If you would like to ask us to carry out an internal review, you should get in touch within two months of the date of this letter. There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
