Thank you for your request for information concerning Licence holders for specific UHF frequencies in

We received this request on 25 March 2026 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 and the Environmental Information Regulations 2004 (“the EIR”).

Your request & our response

Under the Freedom of Information Act 2000, I request the following information:

1. Current licence holders (including any special temporary authorisations or test licences) for transmissions in the following frequency bands withinor nearest 1 km grid square

- * 380-400 MHz (TETRA / public-safety band)*
- * 760-820 MHz (UHF / extended cellular band)*
- * 416-431 MHz (specific cluster logged locally)*

<https://www.ofcom.org.uk/spectrum/frequencies/spectrum-information-portal> for 416-431 MHz. If you scroll down on this page, you can enter the specific frequencies you are interested in. You will need to click “Select All” under the “Product Description” on the left (presuming you are interested in all products). You can also filter the results by “Region/Area” e.g. Hounslow.

We do not hold information regarding 380-400 MHz that you have requested.

Virgin Media O2, EE, Vodafone and Three hold nationwide spectrum access licences for the 760-820MHz band. The frequency allocations for this band can be found here - [Mobile Wireless Broadband below 5 GHz Jan 2026](#).

2. Any records of unlicensed or interference complaints for the above bands in [Your Postcode] since January 2024.

Request an internal review

If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
