Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information concerning Postal sectors full fibre broadband.

We received this request on 13 March 2026 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

Your request

"We are seeking to obtain a list of U.K. or Country specific (e.g. England, Northern Ireland, Scotland, Wales) Postal Sectors in which Full Fibre broadband (to cabinet, or property) is available to residential dwellings.

Our reference to Postal Sectors is intended to be specific and refers to the full Outbound part of the postcode (i.e. Postal District) AND, separated by a space the first character, which is always Numeric, of the Inbound part of the postcode.

If you can supply such information, we would be pleased to receive it electronically as a single column table in CSV UTF-8 (Comma delimited) (.csv) format, or, in Excell."*

Our response

We published information on fixed broadband availability at postcode level as part of our [Connected Nations publications](#); the most recent data sets can be found [here](#). Availability is mainly provided for different speeds rather than technologies, but we do report on the availability of fixed-line broadband delivered by a network that consists wholly or in part of optical fibre (referred to as "next-generation access").

Request an internal review

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

If you would like to ask us to carry out an internal review, you should get in touch within two months of the date of this letter. There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will

try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
