Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information about EMF Radiation, Smart Meter Hazards, VR Technology Risks, and Contaminated Water Exposure.

We received this request on 19 January 2026 and we have considered your request under the Environmental Information Regulations 2004.

Your request

- 1. Acknowledge receipt of this notice and evidence file*
- 2. Disclose what health risk assessments your department has undertaken since 2020 on these matters*
- 3. Confirm your position on EMF safety thresholds, VR safeguarding, smart meter enforcement, and water system compliance*
- 4. Identify who in your department holds responsibility for risk governance in each of these areas*
- 5. State what public consultation has occurred and how safeguarding duties have been upheld*

Our response

We do not hold the requested information.

As previously explained in our response to you dated [22 September 2025](#), Ofcom is not a public health body. We have explained our role in that previous response as well as our response of [30 September 2025](#). We note that you have now sent us various requests and letters which request health related information from us and would be grateful if you could take our previous responses of 22 September 2025 and 30 September 2025 into account before considering submitting any further requests.

Request an internal review

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

If you would like to ask us to carry out an internal review, you should get in touch within two months of the date of this letter. There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
