Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information concerning correspondence with various radio stations.

We received this request on 6 February 2026 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

Your request

I am writing to request copies of all information held by Ofcom relating to complaints, investigations, enforcement actions, and any other pertinent records concerning any licensee where Chris Gregg is named as a director, shareholder, or otherwise associated individual.

Specifically, this request relates to the following radio licences and stations:

- * Northampton DAB station(s)*

- 1. Copies or summaries of all complaints received regarding these licencees, including the outcome of each complaint.*
- 2. Details of any enforcement action, including warnings, fines, or licence revocation proceedings.*
- 3. Any other records or correspondence that are relevant to the assessment of whether these licencees have complied with Ofcom licence conditions.*

We are unable to provide any further details of complaints other than what is published in our Bulletin, as this information is exempt from disclosure pursuant to section 44 of the FOI Act. Under section 393 of the Communications Act 2003 we are prohibited from disclosing information which relates to a business which we have obtained in the course of exercising our functions in relation to compliance with the Ofcom Broadcasting Code (or other Ofcom codes or licence conditions), unless we have the consent of that business or one of the statutory gateways under section 393(2) of the Communications Act 2003 is met, neither of which applies here. Section 44 is an absolute exemption and does not require a public interest test.

2. Details of any enforcement action, including warnings, fines, or licence revocation proceedings.

We have published four decisions following investigations into Horizon Radio (Milton Keynes) and Revolution Radio. These are published in the [Broadcast and On Demand Bulletin](#). We have published one sanction decision regarding Revolution Radio's compliance with its Key Commitments. A [copy of this decision](#) is published on our website. There is no ongoing action following these decisions.

In addition to this, two investigations have been opened into Horizon Radio (Milton Keynes) and Horizon Radio (Northampton).

3. Any other records or correspondence that are relevant to the assessment of whether these licencees have complied with Ofcom licence conditions.

While we hold information in scope of this question, we consider that the exemption under section 44 of the FOI Act, as explained on page 3, applies.

Request an internal review

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

If you would like to ask us to carry out an internal review, you should get in touch within two months of the date of this letter. There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
