## Freedom of Information request: Right to know request

Thank you for your request for information concerning Ofcom's meeting with the US House Judiciary Committee. We received this request on 20 February 2026 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000 ("the FOI Act").

### Your request

*I am requesting information relating to Ofcom's meeting in July 2025 with the US congressional delegation led by House Judiciary Committee Chairman Jim Jordan, as referenced by Ofcom's Media Office in correspondence dated 29 July 2025 confirming that a meeting was scheduled.*

*To ensure this request remains within the cost limits under section 12 FOIA, I am seeking only the following specific records:*

*1. The official minute, note, or summary record of the meeting between Ofcom representatives and the US delegation led by Chairman Jim Jordan held in July 2025.*

*If no formal minute was produced, please provide: Any briefing note, internal summary, or written record produced after the meeting summarising the substance of discussions.*

*2. The list of attendees (names and titles/roles) present at the meeting on behalf of Ofcom and the US delegation.*

*3. Any briefing materials prepared for Ofcom attendees specifically for this meeting, such as:*

*Briefing documents that set out anticipated lines of questioning or topics expected to be raised by the US delegation;*

*Documents setting out Ofcom's agreed lines to take in response.*

*For the avoidance of doubt, I am not requesting all correspondence about the visit, nor general background documents about the Online Safety Act. This request is confined to documents directly related to this specific meeting and with previous engagement with the US delegation/House Judiciary Committee.*

## Information Requests

### **Request an internal review**

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

If you would like to ask us to carry out an internal review, you should get in touch within two months of the date of this letter. There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
