Thank you for your request for information concerning gifts and hospitality to board members, senior executives or directors.

We received this request on 24 April 2026 and we have considered your request under the Freedom of Information Act 2000.

### Your request & our response

*Please provide all hospitality, gifts, travel, accommodation, conference passes or event invitations accepted by board members, senior executives or directors since 1 January 2023, where the donor was an organisation regulated by your body.*

Ofcom has a [Gifts & Hospitality Policy](#) which we publish on our website. Please refer to this for information on our policy relating to gifts.

Please note that Gifts and Hospitality data (which also includes conference/events passes) is published in arrears. Data for the period January 2025 to December 2025 is available [here](#). Older data, e.g. from 1 January 2023 to December 2024, is available through the [National Archives](#).

The plan is to publish the next batch of data for the period January to March 2026 at the beginning of July 2026. The information is currently being collated, checked and going through our sign-off process. We therefore consider that it is reasonable in the circumstances to withhold disclosure of this information until July, in accordance with Section 22 of the FOI Act, which states that information is exempt if it is due for future publication.

We have not found any information held relating to accommodation or travel, however, please note that it is Ofcom's policy not to accept travel and accommodation from organisations we regulate.

### Information Requests

#### Request an internal review

If you are unhappy with the response you have received to your request for information, or think that your request was refused without a reason valid under the law, you may ask for an internal review. If you do, it will be subject to an independent review within Ofcom. We will either uphold the original decision, or reverse or modify it.

If you would like to ask us to carry out an internal review, you should get in touch within two months of the date of this letter. There is no statutory deadline for us to complete our internal review, and the time it takes will depend on the complexity of the request. But we will try to complete the review within 20 working days (or no more than 40 working days in exceptional cases) and keep you informed of our progress.
