

## Business Impact Target: Ofcom list of non-qualifying regulatory provisions 9 June 2017 – 14 November 2019

Under the Small Business, Enterprise and Employment Act 2015 ('the SBEE Act'), we have a statutory obligation to produce an assessment of the economic impact on business of every qualifying regulatory provision we make during the relevant period. A qualifying regulatory provision is one that does not fall under any of the exclusions prescribed in the SBEE Act.1. This document is also <u>available on our website</u>.

Under the SBEE Act, we are also required to publish a list of 'non-qualifying regulatory provisions', which are those that fall under one of the exclusions set out in the SBEE Act. This document sets out our non-qualifying regulatory provisions for the relevant reporting period of the Parliament which lasted from June 2017 to November 2019.
