

I have prepared the following comments for the Computer Weekly report on House of Commons debate on 12 October 2105.

There can be little doubt that the BT Group are no longer sufficiently in control of their operations and must be broken up.

Local Authorities / BDUK fund FTTCabinet deployments with taxpayers money BUT BT won't afford about £40 they must add for a second duct when the FTTCabinet is installed.

Thus all Huawei 288 cabinets only have 96 connections available until BT disrupt everything to re-excavate the same trench. This can take up to TEN MONTHS and STILL COUNTING !

N.B. 288 is often under one half of the green cabinet line count too.

A casual scan shows Abinger 1, Bramley 1 & 9, Shere 5 all in Surrey, Crediton 10, Ottery St Mary 1, Skipton 16 are all falsely shown as "High Demand" purely because of BT's accountancy practices. There will be many more like this yet Local Authorities don't lift a finger.
