Yes, I agree that Radio Amateurs should be free to decide for themselves whether or not they wish to use RSLs and suffixes.

I would like to see existing, as well as future, Foundation and Full licence holders free of having the RSL embedded within their callsign on the license document.

I find it of no assistance or useful purpose to be required to use an RSL, and on occasions it is confusing. I frequently travel the length and breadth of Great Britain by car and do not wish to be concerned about having to vary my callsign prefix whilst travelling. For example, in the vicinity of western Shropshire alone, I may cross the "border" several times within the space of a few minutes whilst remaining on the same road; and whilst driving I do not require my attention further perverted by archaic RSL etiquette. Once parked up or staying longer when visiting it is not always apparent, without detailed investigation, which RSL would be applicable. If I find this to be a needless encumbrance, then it may also be, and particularly so, for visitors from abroad who are temporarily visiting, or even frequently travelling throughout Britain.

Whilst it might be of interest to those with whom I communicate what my location is at any given moment, the RSL conveys no meaningful detail at all, and if anybody needs to contact me officially the use, or otherwise, of RSL serves no purpose in this regard. I would like to not have to be tied to using the RSL as applied to my home and main station address because I see it as an additional unnecessary hindrance, and if I wish to relocate to a new house my callsign prefix might need to change simply as a result of crossing a county border.

As the proposal is to provide choice about its use, this practical solution is more than just a good compromise in correcting a longstanding anomaly because it offers scope for those participating fully within the hobby and which I feel sure many radio amateurs will quickly appreciate, with no detrimental affect to anyone or to authorised and international practice.
