<p>We invite interested parties to provide feedback on the Roadmap.</p>	<p>Confidential? – N</p> <p>Ofcom states that its ‘mission to make communications work for everyone’. Sadly, this is not true at present and will not be true until Ofcom takes into account those people who are made ill and disabled by man-made radio communications. This may be a relatively small proportion of the population, perhaps 3.6%, but they still want and deserve to live full and healthy lives in the UK.</p> <p>Ofcom states that it welcomes ‘feedback from stakeholders and interested parties on this Roadmap’, but in the past it has ignored the concerns of people harmed by the levels of radiation it allows. It is unacceptable for Ofcom to blame PHE, since PHE has to recommend IC-NIRP for which it supplies members. Ofcom should instead follow a scientific approach and adopt international guidelines like Bioinitiative, EUROPAEM 2016, IGNIR or Seletun, which include long-term non-thermal effects, not IC-NIRP’s arbitrary and unscientific short-term and only thermal effects which fail to include established effects like cancers, infertility and neurological harm.</p> <p>Ofcom should also conduct an Environmental Impact Assessment. Many scientists think that the reduction of insects by 70-80% and the growth of plant viruses and bacteria are related to the ever-increasing electrosmog.</p>
