party's past electoral performance and current support in each nation, and should be used to consider their inclusion on the major parties list for specific elections.

We believe that this is the only approach that correctly measures and reflects the strength of support for a political party within the devolved nations of the United Kingdom.

The other potential approaches do not properly recognise the devolved nature of politics within the UK. The 'national profile' referred to in the discussion of the "Two stage approach" in 2.27 and 2.26 is a profile created by predominately English based and focused media and polling, and therefore is not a true reflection of "UK wide" public opinion and electoral support.

We would also note that the lack of polling data for Wales, as noted in A2.6, is a serious concern, and poses a risk to the fairness and parity of assessment of political support alongside the other nations of the UK.

Question 2: Do you have any comments on Ofcom?s current preliminary views in paragraphs 2.36 to 2.42 above on the effect of the application of the various methodologies to decide the Ofcom list of major parties ahead of the 22 May 2014 elections?:

For the reasons outlined in our response to Question 1 above, we would see Ofcom use the Nation-by-Nation approach to decide the list of major parties ahead of the May 2014 elections as outlined in 2.42 and the proposed amendment that pertains to this approach should be adopted.
