ITV is a multiplex operator on the DTT platform, via SDN (which is a wholly-owned subsidiary of ITV plc) and Digital 3and4 (which is jointly owned by ITV and Channel 4). Digital 3and4 holds the licence for DTT Multiplex 2. SDN holds the licence for DTT Multiplex A.
