Their news and views are not appropriate to North Devon e.g. the traffic situation on the Tamar Bridge has no relevance to the A361 in North Devon being blocked by an accident but is not reported to local drivers by the "local" radio! The fact that only 7 hours of local material comes from the whole of Devon we want the FM licence to be re-advertised to bring a chance of Local Radio back again so it will have the chance for local radio to be brought back to North Devon. Lantern FM provided an excellent service before Heart bought them out; since Heart FM took over the service is almost non-existent and I rarely listen to Heart now.
