Heart (Global Radio) operating from London with only occasional traffic information from South Devon (over 80 miles away). If this is all "local" a radio station has to offer to keep using the only local FM license available I have great doubts about the integrity of your organisation.

Digital radio is already available on the internet for those who like this. Analogue FM broadcasting should remain in place as only there a large listening audience is available. To keep the only local analogue FM licence with a radio station which is not local at all seems to me as abuse of public infrastructure.
