I Myself do not watch much TV as over the years it has become more difficult to follow plots in detective stories and a comedy is usually so visual that it just goes over my head and by the time I have asked what the joke was it has moved onto something else and my partner has lost the thread as well, so it ends up with both of us missing out, the old type of programmes such as Porridge, where there is plenty of dialogue is still easy to follow, but the writers of today seem to forget that there is a vast ammount of people like myself that miss out because of the high visual content in programmes now.
