I was rather surprised to note that Audio Description is only on 10% of televised programmes. I would have thought that under various disability discriminations acts that it should be far higher.

My husband was blind (he died recently) but his life was changed by AD. Before AD, 'watching' television was virtually impossible for him. When we got our first ad device his life was changed. It opened a new world to him. He was able to 'see' lots of programmes and then have the pleasure of discussing them with friends and family.

I know the RNIB are asking for the AD to be doubled, but I say it should be increased to 50% at least.
