We all know the world is full of people who want to make vast sums of money out of television - for their personal gain - and there is a danger this might happen if Channel 4 has no PBS remit. I see fewer and fewer men and women in the business who work in the media in order to open minds (to enlighten while they entertain).

Good public service brodcasting generates a wealth that cannot be measured in dollar signs.
