Question 1:To what extent do you consider that DTT, DSat, cable and IPTV are in competition with one another for subscribers of pay TV services? either at present or in the future?:

I believe that they are all in direct competition with each other. Now more than ever.

Question 2:To what extent do you consider the Proposal is likely to deliver benefits to the consumer?:

I think that tis will limit the bandwith available for on DTV for future channel launches and I do not believe that this bandwith should be taken from freeview to be used in the PAYTV market. I do not believe this is in the interest of the consumer.

Question 3:To what extent do you consider that there is scope for sustainable competition in pay TV on the DTT platform and, more broadly, across all pay TV platforms?:

I think that competition is healthy and I believe that it gives the customer choice. I beleive that these plans will not help competition and that they will make Freeview less attractive. Freeview is needed for people who do not want PAYTV.

I feel premium content is fine for customers who want it. There are already lots of PAYTV providers who offer this.

I think that it is the worst thing that could happen. The prices would go up and the quality would go down.

I feel that the spectrum that is set for freeview should remain on freeview. I think that customers will feel confused if there is another dtv box that is PAYTV. There is already a lot of confusion.

I feel that it could really undermine freeview. What is to stop other broadcasters doing the same. Less choice on freeview means that PAYTV operators can make their services more attractive and therefore this should not be allowed.

If so, what form should those conditions/directions take?:

I feel that the DTV market needs to be regulated more to prevent operators like Sky abusing the market for their own financial gain.
