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Question 1:To what extent do you consider that DTT, DSat, cable and IPTV are in competition with one another for subscribers of pay TV services? either at present or in the future?:

they are in healthy competition though sky has the monopoly on sports (IE Premiere ship games)

as they have so much bandwidth and content they can practically dictate the prices people pay, that is a reason i left sky the kept messing me around with the prices and the content.

#### Question 2:To what extent do you consider the Proposal is likely to deliver benefits to the consumer?:

None what so ever as the technology will have to be updated meaning, people who spent £100+ on PVR's or Top up tv boxes will have to spend more money the only way i can see this working is if they offer a free set-top freevie/picnic/top-up t/PVR box to any customers and have the box with on Cam module and the MPEG4/MPEG2 Standards inbuilt and were to show excact broadcasts of the Sky one and sky sports networks on the DTT and SSAT and not to move matches to sky sports 2 or 3, this cannot simply be a taster service for sky to hook people in to get DSAT (SKY Platform) if it is then sky are no worse then drug dealers

# Question 3:To what extent do you consider that there is scope for sustainable competition in pay TV on the DTT platform and, more broadly, across all pay TV platforms?:

I do not honestly think it will work as DTT is going to be our national way of receiving TV and for years (apart from the BBC) it has been free to air.

Pay on DTT will only make the Freeview service go the way on ondigital,

we should have a free service on freeview and leave the platform alone if we wish to pay for something then use DSAT or Cable as that is how it generates the money, freeview should remain free and they should encourage the growth of more channels on the platform first without adding pay tv, as what will happen all the free channels coming to the service will stop and the pay TV will increase leading to a lop sided share of the spectrum in pay TV's way
