

Proposed amendments to section 7 (equipment location) of the Entrerprise Act Undertakings given by BT to Ofcom

Kingston Communications welcomes the opportunity to respond to the consultation regarding the "Proposed amendments to section 7 (equipment location) of the Enterprise Act Undertakings given by BT to Ofcom".

Kingston agrees with the proposed amendments particularly in regard to the removal of the requirements for the CPPUG. However we do have concerns on two parts of section 7 Undertakings on which we make the following comments and suggestions.

Requirement for "an appropriate confidentiality agreement with BT"

As a long established Communications Provider (CP) Kingston has entered many agreements with BT including the Revised Access Network Facilities (RANF) agreement for Local Loop Unbundling. Most of the agreements have confidentiality clauses included. Therefore Kingston does not recognise the need for a "stand alone" confidentiality agreement to allow Kingston to access the information contained in the Estimated Speace Availability Details (ESAD). Kingston are of course aware that other CP's may not be in the same position as ourselves and that a separate Confidentiality agreement may be required. We therefore would make the suggestion that "an appropriate confidentiality agreement" includes any agreement made between the CP and BT that permits access to and use of the information contained in the ESAD.

Notification given to CP's of changes to ESAD

The definition of ESAD includes a requirement for BT to notify the CP's of amendments to the ESAD annually. Kingston is of the opinion that CP's should be notified whenever the exchange space details change with a minimum that updated information is posted on the web-site annually. Kingston therefore make the following suggestion for a further amendment to the definition of "Estimated Space Availability Details".

"Estimated Space Availability Details" means details of estimated space availability within the Exchanges notified to those Communications Providers

- a) on any change; and
- b) placed on a password protected BT website; and
- c) annually in accordance with section 7.1.2

who have signed an appropriate confidentiality agreement with BT.

This notification would allow CP's the maximum time to develop their business case and roll-out strategy which in turn will allow BT the maximum forecast on space usage.
