

Maritime navigational aids and radar/DGPS licence application form – OfW449

Who should use this form?

You may use this form to apply for Maritime Navigational Aids and Radar system licences, including LF or MF DGPS.

Please note that VHF DGPS is authorised under our Business Radio suite of licences.

Conditions

Under the Wireless Telegraphy Act 2006, you must have a licence issued by Ofcom before you establish or use any Business Radio equipment.

Communication preference

Where possible, we send correspondence to licensees electronically. This is quicker for you. By applying online and providing your email address, we assume that you wish to receive correspondence and notifications relating to Wireless Telegraphy Act licences electronically and not on paper. If you do not wish to receive documents electronically, you must opt out by ticking the 'Letter' box.

Completing this form

When completing this application please refer to the notes and complete in dark ink in BLOCK CAPITALS.

All fields are mandatory unless stated otherwise. If you do not provide a telephone number and e-mail, it may delay the processing of this form. If you need to supply further information or clarification, please write on a separate sheet of paper and attach it to this form.

Important

Maritime radio transmitting radio equipment may be operated only or under the direct supervision of the holder of the appropriate Maritime Radio Operator's Certificate or Competence and Authority to Operate. Details of these are available from the Maritime and Coastguard Agency (MCA).

Radio Equipment Directive (RED)

The Radio Equipment Directive (2014/53/EU) has superseded the Radio and Telecommunications Terminal Directive Equipment (R&TTE) Directive (99/5/ EC). All new marine and radar equipment, which is placed on the market and which is not covered by the Marine Equipment Directive (MED – 2014/90/EU – as amended) must conform to essential requirements of the Radio Equipment Directive. Such equipment may be licensed for use in the UK, provided it operates in conformity with the relevant UK Radio Interface Requirement (IR).

Antenna siting

Shared masts with multiple antennas, are commonly used. However, this may cause intermodulation interference problems between different users of the mast. In the event of such a problem we will try to assign an alternative frequency (if it is not an equipment fault) but will not accept responsibility for such interference nor for costs incurred in either changing frequencies or vacating a mast. Please bear this in mind when deciding on your antenna location. Erection of an antenna may require planning permission from your local council.



Application Guidance

Payment

A fee of £40 will be charged annually for each station and frequency. One station and two frequencies will be charged £80. Two stations and one frequency will be charged £80.

Payments must include all bank charges. If Ofcom does not receive full payment, it will return any partial payments received.

How we use your data

We require this information in order to carry out our licensing duties under the Wireless Telegraphy Act 2006.

General information

Under the terms of the Wireless Telegraphy Act 2006, it is an offence to install or use radio apparatus, unless:

- you do so under and in accordance with a licence issued by Ofcom; or
- the apparatus is specifically exempt from licensing.

Responsibility for obtaining and paying for a licence rests with the user of the system, not with the supplier of the equipment. You may need the help of your equipment supplier to complete the technical part of the form. Submitting a licence application form does

The remainder of these guidance notes provide guidance on customer details in Section B.

Question B1 – Existing customers

If you already hold an Ofcom radio licence, you should write your customer reference number in the box provided. Your customer reference number will be quoted in licence documentation or correspondence that we have previously sent to you.

Question B2 – New customers

A licence can only be issued to a legal entity. You should tick one of the options provided. For a partnership, please give the full name of one partner and supply a list of all other partners. The main partner is also required to sign the declaration in Section E.

Question B3 – Licensee name and address

If you are applying on behalf of a Limited Company, a Public Limited Company or a Registered Charity, the registered address of the organisation must be used. The licensee will receive all licensing documentation and correspondence.

Question B4 – Licence contact name and address

This can be an additional contact who should also receive licensing documentation and correspondence.

Question B5 – Payment and billing contact

The payment (billing) contact can be different to either the licensee or licence contact.

Question B6 – Third-party contact

If the licence is being handled by a third-party contact such as a radio supplier, then this can be provided.

Question B7 – Contact for licence trades

Spectrum trading is a process that allows holders to transfer or lease the licence rights to another. It is only permitted for those licences, such as this, where Ofcom has made regulations under section 30 of the Wireless Telegraphy Act. Note that ERP (in a given direction) is the product of the power supplied to the antenna and its gain relative to a half wavelength dipole. The maximum ERP is that in the direction of maximum radiation and is expressed in Watts. The power supplied to the antenna is expressed in the form of peak to peak envelope power (PX or pX). The peak envelope power is defined as the average power supplied to the antenna transmission line by a transmitter during one radio frequency cycle at the crest of the modulation envelop taken under normal operation conditions.

EIRP (in a given direction) is the product of the power supplied to the antenna gain in a given direction relative to an isotropic antenna (absolute or isotropic gain).
