### Description of character of service

Quay FM is for the resident population Alderney and seasonal home owners. It broadcasts a service of local news, information and chat. The station acts as the voice of Alderney, stimulating island debate and opinion and ensuring all speech output reflects the underlying primacy of the island.

The service broadcasts:

- Music. The main type of music broadcast over the course of each week is: soft adult contemporary music, with some specialist music programmes.
- Speech: The main types of speech output broadcast over the course of each week are: local news, information, interviews, features and reports from local organisations.
- The service provides original output<sup>1</sup> for a minimum of five hours per day during summer months (April to October) and a minimum of three hours a day in the winter (November to March).
- The service provides locally-produced output<sup>2</sup> for a minimum of 20 hours per day.

The studio is located within the licensed coverage area.

The service provides a range of community benefits (social gain objectives mandated by statute) for the target community, both on-air and off-air, and in doing so, achieves the following objectives:

- the facilitation of discussion and the expression of opinion,
- the provision (whether by means of programmes included in the service or otherwise) of education or training to individuals not employed by the person providing the service, and
- the better understanding of the particular community and the strengthening of links within it.

Members of the target community contribute to the operation and management of the service.

The service has mechanisms in place to ensure it is accountable to its target community.
