Description of character of service

Listen Lanarkshire is a service for the communities of Shotts and surrounding villages, providing a variety of music and shows highlighting the diverse and rich tastes of the community. It provides information and a voice for all community members, including those from isolated and deprived areas, to share experiences and interests, while promoting the work of local groups and services.

The service broadcasts:

- Music. The main types of music broadcast over the course of each week are: A diverse a range of music from 1920's big band to 21st century pop, dance, rock and metal. Celtic/Scottish music and local bands will also feature.
- Speech. The main types of speech output broadcast over the course of each week are: entertainment, events, education and local news; phone-ins, local politics; faith; and reviews with a late night mix of Scottish podcast talent.
- Programming is in English and Scots.
- The service provides original output¹ for a minimum of 50 hours per week.
- The service provides locally-produced output² for a minimum of 50 hours per week.

The studio is located within the licensed coverage area.

The service provides a range of community benefits (social gain objectives mandated by statute) for the target community, both on-air and off-air, and in doing so, achieves the following objectives:

- the facilitation of discussion and the expression of opinion,
- the provision (whether by means of programmes included in the service or otherwise) of education or training to individuals not employed by the person providing the service, and

¹ Original output is content which is first produced for, and transmitted by, the station and excludes output that was transmitted elsewhere before. Original output can be live, pre-recorded or voice-tracked. Repeat broadcasts of original output and continuous music with no speech content other than advertisements, station idents and/or outsourced news bulletins (i.e. news bulletins produced by a third party) do not meet Ofcom's definition of original output.

² Locally-produced output is content which is made and broadcast from within the station's licensed coverage area. It may include all types of local production including repeats and continuous music, as long as it is created anywhere within the licensed coverage area and is not material that is networked from other stations. Content which is made outside the station's licensed coverage area, but edited and broadcast from within the coverage area, does not meet Ofcom's definition of locally-produced output.

- the better understanding of the particular community and the strengthening of links within it.
